

Holocaust Education During November

The 2021 Holocaust Education began last week and is continuing throughout November. This year, our newly introduced grade 11 Genocide and Crimes Against Humanity class hosted Holocaust survivor Nate Leipciger and his granddaughter, Jenn Green. Several of our English and Social Science classes also met and learned from Holocaust Survivor Max Eisen by joining a livestreamed event hosted on November 4 by Northern Secondary School. Students learned directly about the Holocaust and heard messages of hope for the future.

Our Jewish Students Union will also be hosting Nate Leipciger on Tuesday, November 16 to provide an opportunity for our students to meet and learn directly from a Holocaust survivor. All students are welcome to take part in this special opportunity on the 16th at lunch in room 252 or 143.

Secondary Student Check-In Survey – Thoughts on Modified Semester 1 Schedule

The TDSB is conducting a Secondary Student Check-In Survey on Tuesday, November 9 to learn more about the student experience this year and to request student input to support with decisions for semester 2. Parents and guardians are requested to speak to their student about the modified Week 1 and Week 2 experiences as this will help support students to complete the survey.

On Tuesday, November 9, all students will receive an email from the TDSB with a link to the survey and our teachers will provide designated classroom time to complete the survey. The survey is anonymous and confidential and should take no more than ten minutes to complete. The survey will remain open until Thursday, November 11.

EQAO - Ontario Secondary School Literacy Test - Grade 11s - Wednesday, November 10

All grade 11 and non-graduating grade 12 students will be required to write the Ontario Secondary School Literacy Test (OSSLT) on Wednesday, November 10 in-person at school. All students who are required to write the OSSLT in November, along with their parent or guardian, were sent an email communication about a few weeks ago. Credit Rescue – Wednesday, November 10 – Supporting Students At Risk of Not Meeting Curriculum Expectations

Thank you to all teachers who reached out to students who are struggling and invited these students in for support on Friday! Our next Credit Rescue opportunity for students is **Wednesday, November 10** for Week 2 Classes.

Credit Rescue is an early intervention initiative to support student achievement. Only students who have been contacted by their teacher, Special Education or Student Success departments will attend in-person (or virtually if the student is a simultaneous learner). Students who are not participating in Credit Rescue will be expected to work on subject-related material while remaining at home on this day. Teachers will pause regular classroom activities for this designated day and will focus on Credit Rescue activities.

On Thursday, November 11 @ 11:00 a.m. classes will pause for our Remembrance Day Ceremony. Our School Council is working to create a video message that will be shared with all students.

- rationale behind offering a new course
- needs and interests of the students and the school community
- how the course complements our existing program
- how the course will affect enrolment in other courses
- technology, equipment and associated budgetary cost required to run the course
- implications of the course for the future programming of the school
- uniqueness of the course

Sick Kids - PCR Saliva Test

Our school is working with Sick Kids to allow for faster access to Covid-19 testing. Grade 12 - Upload of Mark & Full Disclosure to OUAC/OCAS

The Ministry informed the Board last Thursday that owing to the Modified Semester Schedule, the Full Disclosure of Marks date has been shifted for all secondary schools to Wednesday, December 15. This will allow students an opportunity to complete approximately 75% of a course prior to deciding whether to continue in or drop a course.
