Social Media and Online Conduct

Many of our students are actively involved in numerous forms of Social Media and are in regular communication with each other online. Parents/Guardians are encouraged to learn more about the apps and forums that their children are using.

While Social Media keeps students connected, it can also create trouble when students are sharing unsafe material or sending harmful messages. The use of apps that allow people to communicate anonymously (i.e. theDMapp) should be strongly discouraged as young people are left vulnerable to bullying and harmful messages from others. Anonymity does not help adolescents develop a sense of online responsibility for their behaviour.

In the 2017 Student Census, 43% of FHCI students reported that Social Media made it difficult for them to complete their homework all the time/often. 38% of students described their own social media use as "almost constant".

Parents/guardians are encouraged to support the development of healthy online habits by helping students manage their screen time and balance real life activities with their online activities. Healthy sleep habits and reducing the amount of time on a device can help to improve to a young person's mental health and well-being.

We work as partners as we try to help our students learn to become and remain responsible digital citizens. Students should be encouraged to speak with responsible adults if/when they encounter inappropriate materials/media/messages.

Culminating Activity Schedule

In the last three weeks of the semester, students will begin to complete culminating activities, large scale evaluations that will allow students to successfully demonstrate curriculum expectations. Culminating Activities are very similar to exams, in the sense that they are scheduled to happen on specific dates, and that student attendance is mandatory. The final schedule will be emailed home in the next few days along with a copy of the "Missed Evaluation Form" which is required if a student is absent from a culminating activity.
