- 1. Deadline for Applying to College (Equal Consideration Date): February 1st
- 2. Deadline for Applying to University: January 15th
- 3. Jan 28, 2020-NOON: Last day to make changes to your semester 2 timetable
- 4. Private School Courses for grade 12 students: If you decided to take a private school course this year and didn't yet add it to the yellow sheet we got from you in September, you should come to Guidance and update your sheet. This applies to grade 12 students only.

Governors' Awards of Distinction: John Proctor Scholarship – York University Criteria:

- Canadian citizen/Permanent Resident/Protected Person
- Minimum average 90%
- Extracurricular & leadership experience or "excellence in other areas of individual endeavour which demonstrate the wholeness of the person and grace of character."

Value: up to \$8000 per year (renewable)

Students must be able to volunteer 3 to 5 times per week (each shift is 3 - 4 hours) from the first week of July 2020 to end August 2020.
