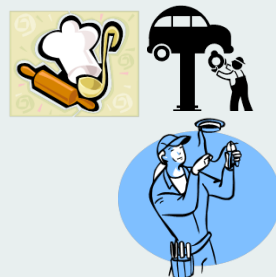


Apprenticeship

Learning a skilled trade on the paid job (75-90%) plus classroom instruction (10-25%)

Skilled Trades fall into the following categories:

- Construction and Maintenance
- Transportation
- Manufacturing
- Service



2 to 5 years before certification (exam required)

Students can start in high school through Ontario Youth Apprenticeship Program www.oyaptdsb.com

Acquire both apprenticeship hours and high school credits Through Coop (indicate on Coop application)

After high school graduation, students will find employer and enroll in college programs

Post-Secondary Pathways In Ontario

There are many different post-secondary pathways to success, including apprenticeship training, college, university and the workplace. At Forest Hill Collegiate Institute, we value all these pathways. University

23 Universities in Ontario

Sizes range from 1000 to 75,000 students
(50% > 20,000 students)

Usually bigger campuses offer broader range of student activities and more options for residences

Academically rigorous or difficult; focus on theories rather than skills

Offer Bachelor, Masters, Doctorate degrees

Some careers require a Bachelor or Graduate degree (i.e. teachers, engineers, lawyers, pharmacists, social workers, psychologists)

Programs range from 3 to 10 years of study and cost between \$6000 - \$8000 per year

Examples:

Architectural Studies at Carleton University
Biotechnology at McMaster University
Business Administration at Wilfrid Laurier University
Creative Industries at Ryerson University
Environmental Studies at Queens University
Life Sciences at University of Toronto

Admissions Requirements

- Ontario Secondary School Diploma
- 6 Grade 12 University or Mixed Level Courses , including Grade 12 University English (ENG4U1) and program specific pre-requisites
- English Language Proficiency Tests for students who have less than three or four years in an English institution
- Portfolio and/or Personal Statements for some programs

Collaborative University and College Programs

Students will gain both the theoretical and practical aspects of learning. They either earn a degree or potentially a degree and a diploma. The two programs at university and college may be consecutive or concurrent.

Examples:

Bachelor of Arts in Psychology at Brock University and Diploma in Social Service Worker at Durham College
Bachelor of Science in Nursing at Ryerson University and George Brown College

Admissions Requirements

- Ontario Secondary School Diploma
- Grade 12 College English
- Pre-requisites vary depending on program area. Usually a senior Math and/or senior Science (may be U/M level)
- English Language Proficiency Tests usually not required
- Degree programs - same as university admissions requirements
