



Apprenticeship is a work-based training program that provides access to well-paying jobs that demand a high level of skill, judgement and creativity. Apprentices are paid while they gain work experience, and their wages increase with their skill level. An apprenticeship is a form of post-secondary education. If you have experience and training in a trade from another province, territory or country, the College's Trade Equivalency Assessment (TEA) can assess your qualifications and experience against all of the training requirements of an Ontario apprenticeship. 

The Ontario College Application Services (OCAS)

OCAS is the clearing house for Ontario College applications



College Application Requirements

- Not required to have 6 Grade 12 courses
- Required to have certain pre-requisites which may include Grade 11 or 12 U/M/C courses

Must check math requirements

 Degree programs will require 6 Grade 12 U/M courses and specific requirements

College Application Process

- Do not need a pin # to apply; OEN required
- Online application: <u>www.ontariocolleges.ca</u>

\$95 application fee

Max of 5 choices; up to 3 programs in one college

Timelines

Application Due Date

- February 1st, 2020:
 - equal consideration date
 - Earliest release of offers by colleges
 - Earliest date by which a student can accept offer
- May 1st, 2020: final date by which an applicant must confirm an offer of admission to their chosen program
- Mid-June, 2020: earliest date that colleges may require payment of tuition fees

Bachelor's Degree Programs

- 4-year applied degrees
 - = practice + theory (many programs co-op)
- admission requirements are the same as university admission requirements - 6 Gr.12 U/M courses
- admission averages sometimes lower than universities'







The Ontario Universities' Application Centre (OUAC)



Ontario Universities'



OUAC is the clearing house for all Ontario university applications

- Fee: \$150 for 3 universities or programs
- Each additional choice: \$50 (no limit)
- Example: 2 programs at any one university = 2 choices
- Limit of 3 choices at any one university including affiliated colleges

 but it is not the clearing house for

First electronic transmission date to OUAC



- Application for each applicant is created:
 - > Demographics
 - ➤ Completed Gr.11 courses with final grades
 - Completed Gr.12 courses with final grades (e.g. summer school)
 - Current courses (both semesters)
 - >Successful completion of the Gr.10 Literacy Test
 - Completion of Community Involvement hours
- Semester 1 mid-term marks are not sent to the application centre
- PIN for each applicant is created and sent to the school

Application Deadline: January 15th, 2020



Recommended time for applications:
Mid-December

Changes can be made to the application after submitting.

February 4th

- Recommended <u>last</u> date to submit changes
- Changes processed continuously each university has a deadline

February 11th

- Second electronic transmission to OUAC
- Final semester 1 marks
- Semester 2 courses
- Additional information on the transcript since the Nov. 5th transmission (e.g. completion of community involvement, final grades for completed private school courses)

April 21st

- Third electronic transmission to OUAC
- Final semester 1 marks
- Semester 2 mid-term grades
- Additional information on the transcript since the Feb. 11th transmission (e.g. completion of community involvement, final grades for completed private school courses)

July 2nd

- Next electronic transmission to OUAC
- Final grades for semester 2 courses
- Additional information on the transcript since the Apr. 21st transmission

(e.g. completion of community involvement, successful completion of Literacy Test, receipt of OSSD, final grades for private school courses)

July 2nd

Note: This transmission is after the school is closed. Therefore all information must be on the transcript before then.

End of January/Beginning of February

- Conditional offer based on Gr.11 and Gr. 12 courses already completed and 2018–2019 courses in which student is enrolled
- Very <u>limited number</u> of offers
- No refusals at this time

March/April

 Conditional offer based on semester 1 final Gr.12 marks final Gr.11 marks in relevant courses and semester 2 courses in which student is enrolled

No refusals at this time

May 27th

Last date for offers

June 1ST

Earliest date by which Ontario Universities may require a response

Conditional Offers

- Student must maintain a certain average as specified in the offer and/or certain grade in prerequisite courses
- August 27th transmission if student has not met all the requirements (conditions, diploma) offer will be rescinded.

Acceptances

- Online
- Must be received at OUAC by the deadline indicated
- Offers may be rescinded if acceptances arrive after deadline

Canadian



- Applications online
 - deadlines are student's responsibility
- English language Quebec universities (McGill, Concordia, Bishop's), Dalhousie, University of King's College, U.B.C., Simon Fraser, Victoria, University of Calgary, UNB, St. Mary's
 - apply after applying through OUAC
 - OUAC reference number required
- All other Canadian Universities/Colleges
 - student must inform Guidance dept.
- Note: each university has own application fee

American



- Over 5000 universities
 - research/deadlines are student's responsibility
- Ideally, begin research in Gr. 10/11







Anonymous poll taken yesterday
Asked 100 Grade 12 students
how they were feeling

What would you like your parent(s)/guardian(s) to hear or understand when you are under a lot of stress?

"I would like them to understand that I feel overwhelmed and sometimes it is for reasons within my control and sometimes it is for reasons outside of my control. Nonetheless I am trying my best to handle my issues and calm down and there is nothing I can further do."

"There's a lot of hard decisions I have to make and I need to take my time with everything"

"I know the situation I'm in, I understand that this is my future, but they have to understand that I always get things done, just in my own way."

"When I'm complaining about my problems I'm not expecting you to find a solution I just want you to listen to me - to put yourself in my place and remind yourself that it is not as easy as you think it is"

"That sometimes as students we need space and need time to shutdown too, for example I go on walks and that is my downtime to chill and not be on "go" mode. We all need that especially now with all the assignments going on.

We don't hate you but sometimes we need to be alone to think and calm down and be able to bounce back. I feel like not only myself but all of us feel like our brain is on 100miles per hour in school because so much is in our head. Let us have some space please sometimes."

"That I will end up where I need to be even though it may not be the best university. That I am working hard and that where I end up is not a reflection of them but of my work."

"I would like them to understand that life is different now. When we get out of university it is not as easy to get a job, therefore we must work harder to achieve more, thus causing our stress to increase. They need to understand that we have many stressors not only school related, therefore give us space, encouragement, support, and patience when we are overwhelmed."

How would you like
your parent(s)/guardian(s)
to support you when you are feeling
stressed or overwhelmed?

Give us space - be available - allow us to take breaks - allow us to focus

Take time to listen to me instead of just giving instructions/information/advice

Parents should stay clam and trust us

Provide positive, kind and encouraging words Less focus on setting their expectations

Help me with an outline and a plan, then give me time and space to figure things out and complete the plan independently.

Reassure me that everything will be okay, as long as I try my best. Let me know that they will be proud of me, regardless of what I choose to do.

Create a quiet and calm environment to help me focus and feel less stressed

Give hugs without asking questions

Ask me what they can do to help

Make me food (it's appreciated!)
