We value the voices of all our families as we work together to make informed decisions impacting our children's well-being, engagement, achievement and overall experience at Forest Hill. It was wonderful seeing so many families for Parent-Teacher Interviews. It is very important to maintain an open line of communication with your child's teacher(s) as they are your first point of contact. We are committed to helping all students succeed and reach their goals. In the face of adversity, it is our objective to work through any challenges that may arise, rather than simply working around them. Thank you for your partnership as we work together to build resiliency in our children.

The temperature has dropped recently and a number of students have been absent due to various illnesses. We want to prevent the spread of viruses, so please keep your child home if he/ she is ill. Remember, if your child is too sick to go outside for recess, for your child's safety and for the safety of other students, please keep your child home. Supervision is only provided outside during recess time (unless weather falls under one of the conditions below).

Conditions warranting indoor recesses:

- (a) Rain, thunderstorms, lightning, hail, extreme winds and extreme cold.
 (b) Cold weather: When temperature and/or windchill factor indicates -28C or lower children will remain indoors due to risk of frostnip and frostbite.
 (c) When temperature and/or windchill factor indicates -20 to -28C, recesses may her shortened to 10 minutes and lynch.
- (c) When temperature and/or windchill factor indicates -20 to -28C, recesses may be shortened to 10 minutes and lunch recess be 20 minutes depending on local conditions. Children should be monitored closely for signs of frostnip, frostbite or difficulty breathing.

Severe Weather Policy

Please make sure your child(ren) come to school prepared to spend time outdoors. Hats, mitts, boots and a warm jacket are important to keep students comfortable during lunch and recess.

Since the temperature has dropped recently, we are finding a number of parents, guardians and caregivers waiting inside the building before dismissal. This jeopardizes the safety and security of our students. If you need to enter the building, please start your visit at the Main Office. All guests to the school must have a Visitor Badge on them at all times during their visit. We kindly ask that parents, guardians and caregivers wait outside until dismissal. During cold weather advisories, we may create a designated waiting area in order to keep everyone safe.

Bullying Prevention Week

Bullying is defined as a form of repeated, persistent and aggressive behaviour directed at an individual or individuals that is intended to cause (or should be known to cause) fear and distress and/or harm to another person's body, feelings, self-esteem or reputation. Bullying occurs in a context where there is a real or perceived power imbalance.

Each classroom will be involved in the further development of bullying prevention and awareness with a daily focus this week. Some topics for discussion may include physical, verbal, electronic, written forms of bullying, cyber-bullying (risks of social media and our digital footprint), keeping hands and feet to ourselves, power imbalance, the distinction between conflict, bothering and bullying and ways to access or seek support for bullies, victims and bystanders.

Bullying prevention and intervention is about more than just eliminating bullying, it's about promoting healthy relationships. When students have healthy relationships in their lives, they are less likely to bully others and are more likely to support students who are bullied. Promoting healthy relationships is a key way to prevent bullying and create a safe and accepting school climate. Please take this opportunity to have meaningful conversations at home about bullying. A positive school climate is our shared responsibility.
