Spirit Wear Deadline is Friday, March 29th, 2024


The online school spirit wear store is only open until tomorrow, Friday, March 29th, 2024!

Updates from the School Trustee

March Update from Trustee Sara Ehrhardt

I hope that it has been a good March break for everyone.

We are well into budget season for the TDSB. There is a structural deficit brought on by provincial underfunding. Starting next week there will be meetings that discuss in more detail proposed cuts and increases to fees that could take place without provincial funding to fill the gaps. There are proposed changes to outdoor education, continuing education including Learn4Life and International Language programs, and proposed fees for International Baccalaureate (IB) programs, among other things.

I do not support cuts and believe that increased provincial funding is needed for our schools. There is an opportunity for members of the public to present to the TDSB on March 26, I would encourage people to come and share views with the full board of trustees.

I will also be holding an in-person drop-in time the evening of Thursday, March 28 for anyone who would like to discuss the budget or other topics with me directly - please save this time and stay tuned for updates on location. The full board's first budget vote is Tuesday, April 2 and I wish to hear your views before that time. I am also happy to discuss other topics as time allows.

Solar Eclipse 2024 - Fun Facts

On Monday, April 8th, 2024, the solar eclipse's path will pass through Toronto and plunge the city into darkness for a few minutes. Due to safety concerns, there will be no school!

Here are a few fascinating facts about this years eclipse:

- * Total darkness will begin in Toronto at around 3:15 pm
- * A solar eclipse occurs when the Sun, Moon, and Earth are aligned, casting a shadow on our planet
- * Totality (or total darkness) lasts a maximum of 4 minutes and 28 seconds
- * The totality is safe to look at. Only when the Moon's disk covers that of the sun
- * You won't need a telescope
- * The longest possible duration of darkness during the solar eclipse will be 7 minutes and 32 seconds on June 13th, 2132!
