#### **Swim Suits**

For Junior and Senior Falcons who participate in Frankland's swim classes, here are some guidelines for bathing suit shopping:

- Bright Colours this makes the child visible in the water, especially in open water. A visibility test from Alive Solutions provides an idea of what to buy.
- Transparency Test make sure bathing suits pass the wet check. Look to buy swim suits that are thick or double lined.
- Quality Avoid bathing suits that are made cheaply by buying from a sports store or companies such as TRY and Speedo. If you want bathing suits to last even longer for on pieces only buy one size smaller. Bathing suits will be tight but will stretch out over time. Bathings suits are also likely discounted off season!



September 30 is National Day for Truth and Reconciliation. Together we recognize the legacy of Canada's residential school system and continue to learn the many truths of these institutions. During Truth and Reconciliation Week, September 25 to September 30, schoolsparticipate in events offered by the National Centre for Truth and Reconciliation.

Orange Shirt Day, established in 2013 by Phyllis Webstad, recognizes the legacy of the Residential Schools System for First Nations, Métis, and Inuit families and communities. By wearing orange, we acknowledge the truths of Residential Schools in Canada, we honour Survivors, and we remember the thousands of children who died, many of them buried in unmarked graves. This year, TDSB will honour Orange Shirt Day on Friday, September 29th.




