Making the Best of Winter Weather at our School



Fresh air and exercise are important for children. It keeps them physically fit and helps them stay alert all through the school day. Parents can help by making sure their children come to school prepared to spend time outdoors. Hats, water-proof mitts, boots and a warm jacket are important.

But extreme cold can be dangerous, and parents want to know that their children will be safe. When the temperature is predicted to drop below -15C, the City of Toronto may declare a cold weather alert. Schools are very sensitive to the needs of our students, especially when the windchill is below -20 C (outdoor time may be shortened).

The <u>TDSB Severe Weather Protocol</u> is flexible, so that every principal can make a decision that meets the needs of his or her school. It sets guidelines for when to allow students outside for recess, when to make outdoor breaks shorter, and when to keep students inside altogether.

Students are kept indoors for recess and lunch times for a number of weather conditions such as rain, lightning in the area, extreme winds and extreme cold. When temperature and wind chill measure -28C or lower, students are kept indoors.

If a student's medical condition requires further consideration due to weather conditions, please contact the school office.

Stay Healthy During Flu Season

Toronto Public Health is recommending that whenever students and staff experience flu-like symptoms, they are sent home and do not return to school until they are no longer infectious to others. Therefore, ill students and staff should be symptom-free (especially from vomiting and diarrhea) for at least 48 hours before returning to school.

As parents, you can also assist by:

Reminding children to wash their hands often especially after using the washroom and before and after eating;

Reminding children to cover their sneeze and cough;

Watching for symptoms of vomiting, diarrhea, dizziness, and/or high fever:

Informing the school if your child is ill;

Keeping your child at home when he/she is ill.

First and second dose: Open to individuals aged 5 and older who live and/or go to school in any postal code. At this time, children need to have had their 5th birthday to be eligible. Children aged 5-11 can get their second dose 21 days after the first dose with informed consent from their parent/guardian.

Third (booster) dose eligibility: Open to individuals aged 18+ who live and/or go to school in any M Postal code.

Walk-ins welcome from eligible individuals while supply lasts. Either Pfizer or Moderna will be administered.



January's Teaching is Respect.



During the month of February, the Toronto District School Board proudly recognizes **African Heritage Month**. It is an occasion to celebrate the many achievements and contributions of peoples of African descent to Canada and the world. The chosen theme for 2021-2022 is NIA: Walking in Our Purpose.

The first Black Canadian woman elected to Parliament, the Honourable Jean Augustine, introduced a motion to recognize February as Black History Month. The motion was carried unanimously by the House of Commons. In December 1995, the House of Commons officially recognized February as Black History Month in Canada. At the Toronto District School Board, a motion to recognize African Heritage (Black History) Month was carried in January 2002 and reaffirmed again in January 2004.
