5. Financial update – Michael John:

- Opening balance for 2018/19 school year \$2,653.38; current balance \$6,980.29
- January transactions:

- Projected 2018/19 closing balance \$746.29
- Confirm funding for Scientist in the School:
 - \$205.00 per workshop, 1 workshop per grade = \$1640.00
 - Jenny Gloria moved to approve the use of council funds to fund Scientist in the School. Unanimous approval.
- Artist Taya:
 - Coming to school for planning meeting next week
 - \$4000.00 earmarked for this activity, need to confirm cost asap
 - Ask Artist Taya for art grant suggestions to help with funding

6. Fundraising - Jenny Gloria

- Request for council finding support for Science Centre field trip
 - Bursary received (\$800 for bus and \$1,500 for excursion)
 - Cost of field trip is \$18 per student
 - Short by \$1,020, will charge \$5 per student, left with \$320.
 - Request for council to split difference with school and pay \$160 each
 - Jenny Gloria moved to approve council funding of \$160.00 for the Science Centre field. Priti Atodaria seconded. Unanimous approval.
 - Numbers to be confirmed 1 week in advance of the trip
 - Contingency plan needed for those who can't afford to pay or those who need to opt out and need supervision at school
 - Volunteers with PRC welcome, cost to attend = \$5 (for IMAX movie)

7. Parents Reaching Out (PRO) Grant – Jenny Gloria

- Date changed to Thursday, April 4th due to Dr. Doug and Social Worker's availability
- Budget = \$1000.00 to cover:
 - Presenters
 - Materials
 - Snacks/Drinks
 - Childcare (x3 staff)
- Current proposal is 3 x 35 minute rotating sessions:
 - Dr. Doug Schmidt (parents) / Mr. Moutadayne (children)
 - Social Worker Elizabeth (parents) / Nurse Heather James (children)

- Food and Nutrition interactive demonstration (parents and children)
- Members shared ideas and options for the sessions, key questions and comments included:
 - Is it possible to compile questions for Dr. Doug in advance? Suggest using SurveyMonkey.
 - Ms. Ponka to confirm with Dr. Doug how early he'd prefer questions, would they be helpful in preparing his presentation?
 - Food and Nutrition session need to confirm presenter
 - Suggestions:

 - Maplewood High School student led nutrition workshop
 - Centennial College Culinary School

 - > Belinda and Jenny to check for contacts and make calls
 - Heidi will send Maplewood contact information to Jenny
 - Grant requirement to provide participants with resources
 - Folder was time consuming and not eco friendly
 - Send PDF package following event via email, with links to websites
 - Create a "passport" (rotation schedule) to give families
 - Give an incentive for participants to complete an evaluation e.g. one of Dr.
 Doug's book suggestions
