# What will we be learning in ESL-A?

# Course Content

- There are four parts to the course, called *strands*.
- By the end of the course, you should be able to show you have learned them all. These are called the *overall expectations*.

Strands	Overall Expectations
Listening and Speaking 30%	<ol> <li>Show that you can understand, interpret, and evaluate spoken English.</li> <li>Use English to speak in different ways, both in the classroom and outside.</li> <li>Use proper grammar and language structure when speaking English.</li> </ol>
Reading 20%	<ol> <li>Read and show you understand different types of writing.</li> <li>Learn different ways to understand text.</li> <li>Learn English words through different ways.</li> <li>Find important information in different types of writing.</li> </ol>
Writing 20%	<ol> <li>Write in different ways for different people.</li> <li>Organize your ideas in writing.</li> <li>Use proper grammar, spelling, and punctuation.</li> <li>Use the stages of the writing process.</li> </ol>
Socio-Cultural Competence & Media Literacy 30%	<ol> <li>Learn about the rights and responsibilities of someone living in Canada.</li> <li>Learn about school in Ontario.</li> <li>Be able to understand, create, and interpret different types of media.</li> </ol>

# Assessment and Evaluation
