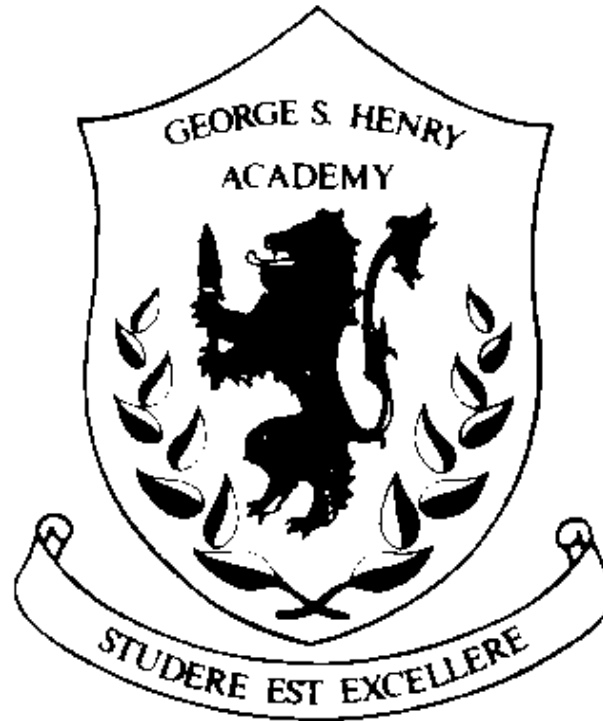


PROGRAM OPTIONS

The Henry Awards Program

The Henry Awards Program fosters student involvement both in the community and non-classroom school activities. Student involvement in the Henry Awards Program is recognized and honoured in the following manner:

- Cultural Activities
- Athletic Activities
- Social Service/Community Activities

Students who participate on teams, are members of school clubs and councils, and spend time volunteering in the community can collect hours and receive an award at commencement. Students must have a minimum of 10 hours in each category to receive an award.

GENERAL INFORMATION

- 1) There are three areas of activities: cultural, athletic, and community.
- 2) Proper documentation must be received for hours to be counted.
- 3) There are five levels of certificates that can be earned:

Bronze	400 hours
Silver	500 hours
Gold	600 hours
Superior	750 hours
Citizenship	1000 hours
- 4) At least one half of the hours earned must be earned within the school. A minimum of 10 hours must be earned in each category.
- 5) Each student is responsible for reporting their hours on the appropriate forms. The forms can be found in the Student Services Department.
- 6) The Awards will be presented to graduating students during commencement.

HAP POLICIES



- 1) All in-school activities must be supervised by a teacher for the hours to count.
- 2) HAP reserves the right to refuse recognition of hours if adequate documentation/evidence is not provided.
- 3) HAP reserves the right to investigate the legitimacy of submitted hours.
- 4) All time submitted must be in 60 minute chunks of time. Any time less than 60 minutes is not counted.
- 5) Activities for which a student received a credit or pay CANNOT be used for HAP hours.
