General Information & News

- 1. Student Clubs and Activities: There are numerous clubs for your child to participate in at Vanier. For a list of these clubs and other activities being hosted by our Student Council, please visit their website, https://sites.google.com/tdsb.on.ca/gvsssac/home NEW!!
- Free Dental Screening Clinic @ Vanier. On Tuesday, October 10 and Wednesday October 11, nurses from Toronto Public Health will be at Georges Vanier Secondary School to conduct a dental screening for any interested student. The nurses will see one patient at a time over the two-day period, in room 120, every 10 minutes from 09:00 to 3:00, except for the lunch hour.

If you would like your child to be seen by the nurses, please direct your child to come to the Main Office and Sign up. Please note that appointments will be granted on a first come, first-serve basis. Also note that this will be the only Dental Screening held this school year at GVSS. Contact VP, Shawn Robertson (416-395-3250 ext. 20012) if you have any questions. *NEW!!*

- 3. Student Activity: This year's student activity fee (SAF) will be \$35 per student OR \$60.00 if you have two children in our school. This SAF fee pays for a Yearbook, Vanier Athletic Association, Student ID card, and Student Council activities. Parents are encouraged to use School Cash Online to pay their child's student activity fee by October 30, 2023. Please use this link, https://tdsb.schoolcashonline.com/, to register for Cash Online if you have not already done so. If needed, financial assistance is available to offset the activity fee. - 4. TTC Tickets: Students in Grades 9 to 12 may be eligible to receive TTC tickets. Please note transportation is not provided for students attending our school under Optional Attendance. - 5. Settlement Workers in Schools (SWIS): Settlement Workers deliver individual/family services or group programs that help new immigrants understand and successfully transition into life in Canada. We have settlement workers on site to support our Vanier community. They work out of room 201 on Mondays Fridays and will be able to provide support in Fasi & Dari, Arabic, Mandarin & Cantonese, Hindi & Urdu, and Russian & Ukrainian. - 6. **Start of Year Forms:** Parents, guardians, and students will be able to complete and submit these forms through Permission Click. A reminder email was sent out recently. Please be sure to complete these forms. If you are having difficulties doing so, please contact our Main Office.



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- Reporting an Absence: TDSB is offering a more efficient way for parents and caregivers to report all student absences, late arrivals, or future absences by using the <u>School</u> <u>Messenger</u> app. You can also report by calling the school messenger portal at 1-833-250-2290. All attendance being reported before 9:00 a.m. must be done using School Messenger. You no longer need to call the school directly.
- 8. TDSB Connects App for Students. The TDSB Connects app is available to all students through the <u>Google Play Store</u> and the <u>Apple App Store</u>. The app contains school announcements and integrates with the school Google calendar and is an excellent way to make information available to students. Both these tools also link into the school's Brightspace Homepage. If possible, students are highly encouraged to download the APP on their devices.



- 9. **TDSB Disconnecting from work Policy**. Please be aware that, as outlined in this policy, TDSB staff will not be available to make or respond to any work-related communications (emails, telephone, texts, etc.) between 7 p.m. and 7 a.m. Monday to Thursday; after 6 p.m. on Friday; Saturday; Sunday; and on statutory holidays.
- 10. Health and Safety Measures. To help reduce the risk of illness from Covid-19 and other viruses, students are encouraged to stay home when sick, complete the school screening (self-assessment) before coming to school, clean their hands often and stay up to date on their vaccinations. While mask-wearing is not mandated, it is still recommended that these are worn when indoors.


Islamic Heritage Month has been recognized across Canada in different ways since October 2007.

In November 2016, the Province of Ontario established October as Islamic History Month through the Islamic Heritage Month Act, and further stated that "proclaiming a month to be Islamic Heritage Month in Ontario will provide all Ontarians, both today and in future generations, with an opportunity to reflect, celebrate, and learn about the rich and longstanding Islamic history in the Province and the diverse roles and contributions of Muslim people in communities across Ontario. This new understanding will in turn help combat anti-Islamic sentiment."
