For example, on Tuesday and Wednesday, Toronto Public Health hosted a Dental Screening Clinic for our students. Many of our classes were on field trips this past week, including all our grade 9 science students visiting the Toronto Zoo and our Grade 12 Social Justice



and Equity and Grade 12 Law classes at the Toronto Holocaust Museum. Field trips have always been opportunities to extend our students' learning. We hope that in our classrooms and on field trips like the ones to the Holocaust Museum, our students will learn to respect, love, and live in harmony with others who don't look like themselves or know the world as they do.

We held our annual Post-Secondary Fair on Thursday, welcoming representatives from over 20 postsecondary institutions and programs. # Financial Assistance for Students Pursuing Post-Secondary Education...New!!!

The Ontario Learning Development Foundation (OLDF) has a GREAT opportunity for students and parents to learn about a post-secondary financial assistance program called the **Canada** Learning Bond (CLB)

The Canada Learning Bond (CLB) is money that the Government of Canada adds to a Registered Education Savings Plan (RESP) to help pay the costs of full or part-time studies after high school for low-income families. Students may be eligible to receive up to \$2000.00 CAD from the CLB that gets deposited into their RESP account.

The Ontario Learning Development Foundation (OLDF) is hosting FREE virtual CLB information Webinars every month via Zoom, which covers what the Canada Learning Bond is and how students can be eligible for it. In addition, they will cover how students can receive a \$25.00 CAD e-gift card sign-up bonus once they apply for the CLB.

### **General Information & News**

- TTC Tickets: Students in Grades 9 to 12 may be eligible to receive TTC tickets. Please note transportation is not provided for students attending our school under Optional Attendance. 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- 3. Student Activity: This year's student activity fee (SAF) will be \$35 per student OR \$60.00 if you have two children in our school. This SAF fee pays for a Yearbook, Vanier Athletic Association, Student ID card, and Student Council activities. Parents are encouraged to use School Cash Online to pay their child's student activity fee by October 30, 2023. - 4. Settlement Workers in Schools (SWIS): Settlement Workers deliver individual/family services or group programs that help new immigrants understand and successfully transition into life in Canada. We have settlement workers on site to support our Vanier community. They work out of room 201 on Mondays Fridays and will be able to provide support in Fasi & Dari, Arabic, Mandarin & Cantonese, Hindi & Urdu, and Russian & Ukrainian. - Reporting an Absence: TDSB is offering a more efficient way for parents and caregivers to report all student absences, late arrivals, or future absences by using the <u>School</u> <u>Messenger</u> app. You can also report by calling the school messenger portal at 1-833-250-2290. All attendance being reported before 9:00 a.m. must be done using School Messenger. You no longer need to call the school directly.
- 6. TDSB Connects App for Students. The TDSB Connects app is available to all students through the <u>Google Play Store</u> and the <u>Apple App Store</u>. The app contains school announcements and integrates with the school Google calendar and is an excellent way to make information available to students. Both these tools also link into the school's Brightspace Homepage. If possible, students are highly encouraged to download the APP on their devices.



7. Health and Safety Measures. To help reduce the risk of illness from Covid-19 and other viruses, students are encouraged to stay home when sick, complete the school screening (self-assessment) before coming to school, clean their hands often and stay up to date on their vaccinations. While mask-wearing is not mandated, it is still recommended that these are worn when indoors.
