Dear Vanier Family,

As usual, this week we had a slew of amazing field trips, including one to the University of Western Ontario this past Thursday, where 42 of our students had the opportunity to compete in an Applied Science Olympics based on concepts learned in grade 9/10 science, and concepts covered in grades 11-12 biology, chemistry, physics, and math. Vanier students did extremely well, taking 1st in "Escape from Cell-catraz" (DNA transcription and protein synthesis event), 1st in Compound Boggle (chemical nomenclature event), 2nd in This Little Pig (fetal pig dissection event), 2nd in Taxonomy Spelling Bee (spelling of scientific genus and species names), and 3rd in Geology Triathlon (rock, mineral and fossil identification). Congratulations to our students and their teachers, Ms. Wong, Ms. Stopnicki, Mr. Devji, Ms. Choi, and Mr. Berhane-Kiflue, for all their hard work over the past few months, as they prepared for these competitions.



On Friday, our LEAP program students embarked on a unique learning experience with a field trip to Little Canada, an attraction in the heart of Toronto. This visit, which showcased Canada's cities and landscapes through miniature art, was a first-time opportunity for many of our students to see Canada in a scaled-down form. The Literacy Enrichment Academic Program (LEAP) is an accelerated program for students aged 9-18 who have recently arrived in Ontario schools with significant gaps in their education.

Also on Friday, we were thrilled to welcome back our grade 10 STEM Students who had been away in Ottawa since Wednesday (May 21). Their return not only marked the end of a successful trip but also reinforced the sense of community and belonging in our school. The students had a blast, learning a lot and making memories that will last years to come. We extend our heartfelt





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thanks to Mr. Devji, who works tirelessly each year to organize and supervise this trip for our students, as well as to all the teachers (Mr. Sproule, Ms. Lam, and Ms. Shahbakhti) who gave up time with their families to accompany our students on this trip.

As we look forward to the next week, we are filled with anticipation for the upcoming SAC election on Tuesday (May 27). This event is a significant part of our school's democratic process, where students will have the opportunity to select next year's student council president and vice president. We encourage everyone to listen to each candidate's video speech during period one before casting their vote. It's an exciting time for our school community!





GRADUATION 2025...mark your calendars! Vanier's Graduation

ceremony for the 2024/25 school year will occur on June 26th, 2025, at 10:00 am at the school. This is certainly one of the highlights of the school year as we celebrate this important milestone with our graduates. As we begin to plan for this day, students will be asked in a few weeks to:

- a) Select their gown size. The school will **loan** students graduation gowns for the day, which students must <u>return at the end of the graduation ceremony</u>. To complete their outfit, students will wear a graduation cap and tassel, which they can keep. Asian Heritage Month at the TDSB: May 2025

Asian Heritage Month has been proudly recognized at the Toronto District School Board during the month of May since 2007. This heritage is also celebrated by the Province of Ontario with the royal ascent of the <u>Asian Heritage Act (2005)</u> and across Canada since May 2002 when the federal Senate adopted a motion to officially designate May as Asian Heritage Month.

This year's theme, **Asian Canadians Up and Rising**, celebrates the strength, resilience, and achievements of Asian Canadian communities. It recognizes individuals and groups who have contributed to shaping Canada's past and present, while also highlighting emerging voices and future leaders



The TDSB is the largest and one of the most diverse school boards in Canada. Nearly one-quarter of our students were born outside of Canada and collectively we speak more than 120 languages. According to the 2023 Student Census, 46% of TDSB students self-identified as Asian.


