Dear Vanier Family,



This past week was another packed one at Vanier! Over ninety of our grades 11 and 12, students wrote their Ontario Secondary School Literacy Test (OSSLT) this past Monday and Tuesday. Passing the OSSLT is one of the requirements for earning a secondary school diploma in Ontario, so we look forward to a high success rate for our students.

On Tuesday, eight of our Vanier had the privilege to attend the 8th Annual Black Brilliance Conference at Downsview Secondary School. This conference is led by Black students for Black students and, celebrates the accomplishments of Black Youth and acknowledges the challenges they face. Students had the opportunity to engage in student-led workshops on a variety of topics relevant to Black students and heard from an aspirational keynote Dr. Chika Stacy Oriuwa, who is currently a resident doctor in psychiatry at the University of Toronto where she earned her medical degree and was the first Black woman to be named sole valedictorian of her department. Special thanks to Downsview SS for providing this rich experience for our students.

From Monday to Thursday of this past week, our students got to have some fun at the expense of our teachers! They got to pie a teacher in the face, tape a teacher to a wall, wax a teacher, and bedazzle the bald head of a teacher—all to raise funds for Mental Health Research Canada. Huge thanks to our student council for organizing these events and to the "brave" teachers who participated in each of them. Please enjoy some pictures from these events on the next page.

As you know, this past Friday was a professional activity day. On this day, our staff had the distinct honour of hearing from **Virginia Barter**, a Toronto-based historical writer and filmmaker whose body of work spotlights the contributions of Indigenous peoples on this land. We appreciate the opportunity to deepen our knowledge of Metis history and way of life. We also deeply appreciate all the artifacts she brought along to bring to life this rich history.

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# **Updates from our Guidance Office**

SPECIALIZED OYAP OPEN HOUSE @ Central Technical School, Room 208 On Thursday, December 12 from 6:00 pm - 8:00 pm

The <u>Specialized OYAP at Central Technical School</u> provides students with the opportunity to develop deep career-related skills.

The one-year program combines multiple technological education credits in a specific trade with a cooperative education experience. Students learn from OCT teachers who are also journeypersons who hold a Certificate of Qualification in their trade. Students have the opportunity to become registered apprentices and work toward becoming certified journeypersons in a skilled trade while completing their secondary school diplomas.

Students participating in these special Programs have an edge when applying to university, college, apprenticeship, or work placements. Traditionally 86% of the students enrolled in the Specialized OYAP have been signed as apprentices in their desired trade. Upon completion of the program, students are eligible to write for Level 1 exemption. **MyBlueprint.** All students who are new to Vanier are required to activate their myBlueprint accounts. myBlueprint is an online application tool that all TDSB students use to complete their course selections for next year. - Reporting an Absence: TDSB is offering a more efficient way for parents and caregivers to report
  all student absences, late arrivals, or future absences by using the <u>School Messenger</u> app. You can

  before 9:00 a.m. must be done using School Messenger. You no longer need to call the school
  directly.





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3. TDSB Connects App for Students. The TDSB Connects app is available to all students through the Google Play Store and the Apple App Store. The app contains school announcements and integrates with the school Google calendar and is an excellent way to make information available to students. Both these tools also link into the school's Brightspace Homepage. If possible, students are highly encouraged to download the APP on their devices.



4. **TDSB Disconnecting from work Policy**. Please be aware that, as outlined in this policy, TDSB staff will not be available to make or respond to any work-related communications (emails, telephone, texts, etc.) between 7 p.m. and 7 a.m. Monday to Thursday; after 6 p.m. on Friday; Saturday; Sunday; and on statutory holidays.

#### 5. Start of Year Forms

The technology used for the Start of the Year forms is changing. The PowerSchool Enrollment Module will be used by families to complete these forms online. Parents/Guardians should have received an email on August 30, 2024, with instructions on how to register for this module. ### 6. Student Login and Password

Returning students - Please note that student accounts remained active over the summer and their passwords did not expire. As a result, student account passwords will not be centrally reset for school opening.

Students in Grades 5-12 can reset their own passwords directly on the login page of many online tools, including Brightspace and Zoom. Once registered, students will be able to use security questions, email, phone, text message or an "authenticator" smartphone app, to validate their password reset requests. **New students** - Students new to TDSB will have their password set to the Shared Secret Password. This is a combination of the last 4 digits of the student number, followed by 2 digits for your day of birth, and 2 digits for your month of birth, followed by "@Tdsb" (case sensitive and 13 characters in total).


### **Semester 2 e-Learning Course Registration**


