c. February report cards/kindergarten communication of learning and interviews

The library is set to open any day! The staff room has been cleaned, new floors and decorations. They may still order furniture. The stage is next on the list to clean up and transition into a working space. Lastly, the HVAC is being looked at and though not 100% sure yet, it doesn't seem that any work will effect the children's programming.
