1) Review and Approval of Agenda

- 3) Principal's Welcome and Update Dan Taylor
 - a. Library (closure due to flooding in April, 2018)
 - TDSB has exhausted all possibilities so now TDSB has moved on to the design phase
 - Book borrowing and the Forest of Reading program still occurring
 - Realistically work will not commence before summer of 2019 which means another full year without a library
 - Parents discussed looking at ways the library could be modified to work as a functioning space for the school year even if only for some uses ie: Toonie Sale, meetings, modified library/research. Perhaps this means purchasing an area carpet? There is ZERO safety concern in the library so really no reason it can't be used in some fashion
 - Action: Dan to confirm what we can do to make the space semi-useable

b. School Safety

- Teachers and parents need to continue to review and emphasize the rules around school ie: no running in the hallways, enter and exit the school in an orderly fashion, stay on the school grounds unless signed out, staying seated in the lunch room, not speaking to strangers in the school yard, entries/exits of the school building etc ..
- Particular attention has been around the entrances to the playground on both the Shaw Street and Givins Street sides. Stakeholders have met to look at whether some sort of barrier could be installed to help remind children of the school yard boundaries. The TDSB will be installing additional fencing / chains at the NE, SE Shaw Street entrances as well as the SW Givins Street (see appendix). The school also recently purchased 6 new 2-way radios to help facilitate better communication.
- Discussion followed around smaller children wandering off school property and the
 importance of teachers counting students regularly and educating the children about
 safety. Discussion also addressed the high numbers in the primary grades and the difficulty
 for teachers to manage approx 30 children at all times. While the school takes this very
 seriously and the staff has been meeting about this, the system isn't perfect, so the entire



community needs to continue to educate and make adjustments to ensure the safest environment possible.

 Note that all of the discussions above have included the school's Safe and Caring Committee. If any parent has suggestions, ideas or interested in learning more, please reach out to Dan Taylor.

c. Sports Update

- A sports update was not given at the meeting due to timing; however, please find below a recap of the upcoming sports teams as well as a report on our fall term.

The next sports teams are: Grade 4/5 Girls' Basketball and Grade 6 Girls' Basketball, both of which Barry Martin, parent coach and I will be co-coaching from October 29th until the end of November. The Boys' Volleyball will be coached by Trevor Lightbody, will start next week and run until end of November.

Our Boys' Soccer Team, coached by Trevor Lightbody and our Girls' Soccer Team, coached by Caroline Garcia, Karen Grasman and Brett Mathies (student teacher), all hosted our tournaments here at Givins/Shaw in early October. I believe both the G/S Girls' Soccer Team and G/S Boys' Soccer Team each came in 3rd place in their pool.

As for Cross Country, we had 65 students from grades 1 - 6 compete at Ashbridges Bay on October 3rd where six Junior students moved on to the South Conference Finals. At the South Conference Finals, we had one grade 4 student, moved on to the Cross Country City Championships to be held at Centennial Park.

d. Kindergarten Staffing

- The new Kindergarten teacher is in place. Welcome Alexandra Melanson!
- As a result of adding another kindergarten the school needed another half time teacher to allow for prep time. Welcome Jessica Marrello who will be at Givins Shaw part time each week.

e. Use of devices during recess / lunch while on school property

- Parents expressed worry that children are gaming and using phones during recesses on school property when the time is meant to get fresh air, run around, use their imaginations, play games, stretch their legs etc ..
- Dan has reported that children haven't been noticeably on their devices much less in the school yard and will continue to remind staff and students to encourage device-free recesses and the importance of play time.

f. Technology update

Adam and Dan provided an update on how technology is being used in the classroom and Adam showed us an example of how he is using google keep. While each teacher is different, the overall sense is that technology is being embraced as a learning tool. 3 classrooms still to outfit with the standard package!
