Traffic Safety Tips

Traffic Safety Tips: Help Make this a Safe Winter Season

As winter approaches, we know that severe weather will be part of our daily lives for the next several months. While traffic safety is an important matter all year long, this is a particularly good time to review what we can do to keep students safe.

The need to be aware and alert at all times, on any road, and even in the most routine circumstances is key to traffic safety. This applies to students and drivers alike. Road conditions can be challenging in the winter months. So to those of us who drive, please take extra care on the roads and in parking lots, especially in areas where children might be present. School staff periodically review street and traffic safety with students. Parents can help reinforce these safety messages with children at home. Below are some tips that might be helpful to review.

- Stop, look, and listen for traffic.
- · Only cross at corners and crosswalks.
- · Make eye contact with drivers.
- Walk on the right side of the crosswalk.
- Wear appropriate footwear to reduce the chances of slipping.
- Never run into the street.
- Obey crossing signals.
- · Cross only if clear.
- Walk on sidewalks.
- Where there are no sidewalks, walk as far away from traffic as possible, facing traffic.

The safety of our students is always a top priority. Let's work together to make the winter season safe so we can enjoy all it has to offer.

News from the Library

The first four months of school are off to a great start with respect to our library program. Students have been showing responsibility by returning their books on time and pride in sharing what they have read with me and their peers.



Our students are continuing to take part in TDSB's "Just Read It!" initiative. We have yet to hear of any winners so I am reminding and encouraging students to visit "Just Read It!" on the Virtual Library. Encourage your child to visit the Virtual Library often for homework help, research purposes, and to enjoy listening to a book as well. Again this year, students may also access all of the passwords and usernames in their agenda on page 9.

Students were anticipating and looking forward to reading Jeff Kinney's latest book in the "Diary of a Wimpy Kid" series called The Meltdown. Students who wanted to be the first to borrow a copy from our library submitted a written piece of no more than 200 words explaining why they should be chosen. Salni was the lucky person to borrow one of our copies. Since then, many students have read and are reading this book.



Students have also enjoyed reading the hundreds of new books that have been added to our library collection thanks to the Indigo Love of Reading Foundation grant. New

books continue to fill the shelves on a regular basis so no one should be without a good book to read. The primary students have had the opportunity to explore both fiction and non-fiction titles that have been added to our collection and along the way we have been discussing features of fiction and non-fiction books. Encourage your child to share their learning with you when they bring home their books.

In the new year, we will begin reading books from the Blue Spruce Reading Program and focusing on activities and themes from these picture books.

I have spent the past couple of months working with Ms. Sadowsky and her grade four class as well as Ms. McDonald's grade fours in social studies as we explore Early Civilizations. Students worked through the inquiry model to research a civilization of their choosing. They then focused on asking questions, finding information from a variety of sources, citing their sources properly and then working with their group to create a final Google Slides presentation which they presented to the whole class.



I also had the pleasure of working with Mr. Ambi and his grade threes and Ms. Sylvan's grade threes as we explored "Strong and Stable Structures" and "Forces" in our science learning.

Students have had the opportunity to conduct a variety of experiments to test their hypotheses and challenge their thinking as they explored both of these units. We focused on the structures in both the natural environment and those which are manufactured.
