
term includes September 4, 2018 to January 18, 2019, and marks and comments will be based on what your child has learned and achieved during that time.

Recess During Cold Weather



Students are kept indoors for recess and lunch times for a number of weather conditions such as rain, lightning in the area, extreme winds and extreme cold. When temperature and wind chill measure -28C or lower, students are kept indoors. Recesses and lunch hour may be shortened if the temperature and wind chill reading is between -20C and -28C.

If a student's medical condition requires further consideration due to weather conditions, or if parents have other questions or concerns about how and when weather conditions affect your child's school day, please contact the school office.

February 18 is a Statutory Holiday




Girls' Volleyball Season

Winter is still a great time to walk and be outside and it's also a great cure for those winter blues! Dress properly and don't let cold, wind, snow or rain keep you from heading out for a walk. Below are some great winter weather dressing tips from Green Communities Canada:



- Keep hands and head covered to prevent heat loss;
- Wear warm, waterproof boots;
- Wear a warm coat that deflects the wind;
- Woolen clothing helps to retain heat;

- On really cold days, wear a scarf over your face and mouth;
- If possible, change wet clothes at school;
- Wear clothing or carry knapsacks with reflective material - it's important to be seen;
- Below -25 degrees Celsius is considered too cold for walking, so move your walk indoors or select another day.



Happy New Year to students, staff, families and friends of the Glen Ravine community of Chinese, Vietnamese, and Korean heritage! According to the Chinese calendar, 2019 is the Year of the Pig. People born in the Year of the Pig (1923, 1935, 1947, 1959, 1971, 1983, 1995, 2007, **2019**, 2031, 2043...) are considered to be hard-working, peace-loving people, who are also generous, patient, reliable and sincere. Those born in the Year of the Pig have a great sense of humour.

Chinese New Year celebrations bring good luck, health and wealth. Family members come together to celebrate this festive occasion. Red is the main colour of Chinese New Year. Some customs and practices include: cleaning the house before New Year; paying off debts and other ways of making a "fresh start"; married couples give money to the younger and unmarried members of the family, which is kept in a red envelope with a good luck message on the coin. After this ritual, family members gather for a feast
