Grade 7 Core French Curriculum

The Grade 7 Core French program is designed to develop essential skills required for second language learning, as well as to foster an appreciation of French culture in Canada, the Americas, and around the world. Students are taught and encouraged to use communicative skills in oral, listening, reading, and writing activities. Resources used in this course provide the necessary tools for the implementation of the expectations in Ontario Grade 7 Core French Curriculum.

Overall Curriculum Expectations

- A. Listening to understand, to interact, and for intercultural understanding
- B. Speaking to communicate, to interact, and for intercultural understanding
- C. Reading for comprehension, to understand purpose/form/style, and for intercultural understanding
- Writing to understand purpose/form/style, to demonstrate the writing process, and for intercultural understanding

Grade 7 Core Program

The program encourages self-expression, critical and creative thinking, problem-solving, intercultural awareness, and independence through learning. The diverse themes and units also provide students with a cross-curricular experience.

After an intensive <u>review unit</u> at the start of the year, students will explore a number of themes which **may** include Food ("Bon appétit"), Technology ("Sur mon écran"), Sports ("Zone Sportive", "Vive les Sports"), Culture ("Réunion à Québec", "Attention, Magasineurs"), Music ("DJ Delf") etc. Resources include *modules* (thematic units), short fictional and non-fictional reading passages, comic strips, short plays, authentic documents, websites, songs, video and audio selections, etc.

Students will be able to describe themselves and others through the use of adjectives, express their opinions/likes/dislikes, make suggestions, and demonstrate use of the present and future tenses. On a cultural level, students will be able to demonstrate an understanding of French language and customs in Canada, the Americas and around the world. Assessment and Evaluation

Students are evaluated in the four strands of listening, speaking, reading, and writing.

Within these strands, students will be assessed in a variety of ways: tests, quizzes, dialogues, oral presentations, reading comprehension activities, listening activities, writing assignments, class participation, etc. **Diagnostic** (assessment for learning), formative (assessment as learning), and summative (assessment of learning) evaluations occur at the beginning, middle and end of each unit of study.

Resources at Home

Students are encouraged to have an English-French dictionary at home. Online dictionaries (bab.la, www.collinsdictionary.com) are also acceptable. Please discuss the responsible use of technology with your child. Students are instructed to look up words, but not to translate their work from English. Assignments written entirely in English, placed into a French translation website, and consequently submitted to the teacher cannot be evaluated.

Students are required to come prepared for class with their French binder, a pencil case, and their agenda. All homework assignments and test dates are recorded in the agenda. To clarify or reinforce concepts taught in class, or for any other student questions, <u>extra help sessions</u> are available after school, or before school by appointment.
