FROM THE OFFICE

We have been busy since our last Parentview! We had the Terry Fox run, Curriculum Night, 50th Anniversary celebration, QSP fundraiser, Superintendent visit on October 4th, Turkey Lunch and we also have completed our three practice fire drills and lock down. On Thursday, October 6, the whole school was involved in the voting process to select our Student Prefects for this school year. A special congratulation to those students who were elected to represent the student body this year and to those who ran for a position. We are very pleased to announce that our office administrator, Dahlia Cowan, welcomed a baby boy named James on Tuesday, October 11th. Mom and baby are doing well!

We have met with our staff to begin the planning stages of our Grade 8 graduation trips taking place the week of June 12-16, 2017. Currently, trips are being planned to Quebec City, Montreal and St. Andrew's by the Sea, New Brunswick. More information will be shared with our students shortly.

Teachers are already in the process of completing your child's progress report which will be sent home on Monday, November 14th. Prior to report cards being sent home, you will be receiving information on how to book interviews with teachers. Parents will be invited to meet their child's teachers on the evening of Thursday, November 17th and during the morning of Friday, November 18th.

On Wednesday, October 12th, most of our students received packages from Toronto Public Health regarding this year's immunization. Here is a breakdown for each grade:

Grade 7 students (boys and girls):

Meningococcal-ACYW -1 dose

Human Papillomavirus (HPV) – 2 doses, 6 months apart

Hepatitis B – 2 doses, 6 months apart

Grade 8 students: (girls only)

Human Papillomavirus (HPV) – 2 doses, 6 months apart

This is the first year that Public Health is immunizing boys in Grade 7 against the HPV virus. **If you would like your Grade 8 boy to receive the immunization for HPV, please contact your child's doctor.** If you would like more information about what immunization your child has received up until this time, please contact Toronto Public Health at 416-392-1250. The school does not keep records on individual students.

We have planned for the whole school to attend a performance at the Toronto Symphony Orchestra on Thursday, October 20th. We expect all students to attend this trip. We will be leaving the school at approximately 9:45 a.m. and travel by school bus to Roy Thompson Hall. Students received a permission form (hard copy and email to parents). On the form there is the option of purchasing a pizza lunch upon their return to school at approximately 12:30 p.m. It is important to receive all forms back to school by Monday so that we can order pizza for students. We have attached another form in case you need an additional copy.

Please be advised that due to the large number of students at Glenview this year, it is not always easy to facilitate deliveries to students in a timely manner (e.g., lunches, notes, gym/pool equipment). Remind students that if they have forgotten something at home they may use the office phone to call home and it is up to them to check if the item was dropped off at the office. Students leaving school are required to have a note that they can show to the teacher to leave class and then show at the office to sign out. When a student must leave school without a note, the parent should come into the school to sign them out. Leaving school during lunch is only allowed when a written permission note is presented to the office. Phone calls, emails and faxes are not an acceptable option as the office is unable to accommodate these requests. We make every attempt not to interrupt the learning in the classroom and appreciate your understanding and assistance.

During the afternoon of October 31st, students will be participating in self-selected activities which will be supervised by staff. We also encourage students and staff to wear a school-appropriate costume. The afternoon options are: a dance in the gym, movie, quiet room, the pool and games room. Students are expected to be at school for the whole day. Phone calls will not be allowed to excuse students.

We are very pleased to see so many of our students involved in the vast array of extra-curricular activities offered at Glenview. Starting as early as 7:15 a.m. and as late as 5:00 p.m., our school hallways are busy with students participating in the many sports and clubs that Glenview has to offer. 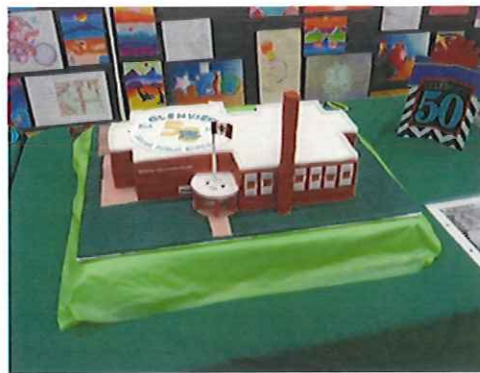

TERRY FOX RUN

Food Bins have arrived from North York Harvest Food Bank, which is the local food bank for our large community. Here are some facts from them that are quite astounding.

- In Canada...there were 14,000, 000 food bank visits over the last year
- Over 300,000 children are serviced through food banks each year in Canada.
- Food banks provide a 2-3 day supply of food, up to four times a month. While it is only meant to supplement what people can purchase themselves, for many respondents it is their main source of food.
- Thirty-eight per cent of adults reported that they go hungry at least once a week, and 16 per cent say their children go hungry at least once a week – within the last three months due to lack of money.
- 1 in 3 food bank users are children
- 40% have graduated from college or university
- 13,000 men, women and children access a food bank every month
