These are three traits that would do us all well!

As all grade 8 parents are keenly aware, we are in the midst of applying to secondary school, both on paper and on myBlueprint. Please ask your children for their course selection sheets. They were partially filled in during our one on one meeting in IT, but you will need to affirm their courses, fill in section A on the first page, and sign the sheet before it is returned to me. Early in February I will again be meeting with your children in order to "submit" their courses digitally. They are NOT to do this until that meeting, please.

Some students have chosen to apply under optional attendance to a high school. Just a quick reminder that these forms must be in the high schools by February 3, 2017. Earlier is certainly better. It is the responsibility of the parent to deliver these to the high schools.

ONTARIO WHEELCHAIR SPORTS ASSOCIATION

The OWSA (Ontario Wheelchair Sports Association) came from Glenview on January 9-13. The OWSA gave each class an opportunity to participate in wheelchair basketball. The first thing we did was listen to the instructors talk about sport chair fun facts and safety rules. We gained useful and interesting knowledge about wheelchair sports like rugby, tennis, athletics (track and field) and basketball. For the last 30 minutes of our time with the wheelchairs we played a real wheelchair basketball game. During the game, we experienced different aspects that are different from stand up basketball - like double dribbling. The rule in stand up basketball for double dribbling is that if you dribble the ball with two hands twice that is considered a double dribble or if you stop dribbling and you dribble again it is also considered a double dribble. A double dribble in wheelchair basketball is different as you are allowed to dribble, pick it up and dribble again.

When we finished playing wheelchair basketball everyone had a good time, for example my experience playing wheelchair basketball was that it is very fun and requires a lot of team work, and teaches leadership. The best part of it was that everybody was equal. Some people thought that playing wheelchair basketball was pretty exciting and was exhilarating. The entire hour was full of excitement. Our class was very excited about the activity that we were doing. I thought that everybody was using teamwork to score points and create offence. To achieve this goal. I thought that wheelchair basketball was a really fun, brand new experience that gave people the opportunity to do something that Para Olympians would do.
