#### FROM THE OFFICE

As we enter the third month of this school year, we are happy that Glenview continues to be full of positive energy. In the last month, our teachers have been released to participate in professional dialogue around the different subject areas. Here is what our focus discussions have been related to:

- English classes will be learning the structure of an essay as they research a specific area related to Indigenous studies. They will share their learning through a media product.
- Math a focus on rich learning tasks, three-part math lessons and assessment, and evaluation that reflects the achievement chart
- French looking at incorporating Indigenous art/drama into their French classes with the help of an Indigenous artist
- History/Geography working with our learning coach to learn more about the inquiry approach to learning with a more intentional focus on Global Citizenship

Teachers are putting the final touches to the Progress Reports which will be sent home on Monday, November 13<sup>th</sup> with interviews taking place on Thursday, November 16<sup>th</sup> and Friday, November 17<sup>th</sup>. On Tuesday, October 31<sup>st</sup> in the afternoon, our students participated in self-selected Halloween activities which were supervised by staff. We were excited to see the number of costumes worn by both staff and students. Students participated in one of the following activities: a dance in the gym, a choice of two movies, two games rooms, quiet time in the library, or free time in the pool. This year we also had a "Catch-up" room for students needing to complete overdue assignments.

#### FROM THE PREFECT DESK

The contest is designed to get students excited about coding with questions that are inspired by topics in computer science and can be solved by applying concepts from the mathematics curriculum.

#### **GRADE 7 IMMUNIZATION**

On Monday, November 13<sup>th</sup> and Tuesday, November 14<sup>th</sup> all Grade 7 students who returned the School Vaccination Consent form will be eligible to receive the following immunizations from Toronto Public Health:

Meningococcal-ACYW -1 dose Human Papillomavirus (HPV) – 2 doses, 6 months apart Hepatitis B – 2 doses, 6 months apart

Toronto Public Health will only immunize your child based on the information you provided on the School Vaccination Consent form. If you would like more information about what immunizations your child has received up until this time, please contact Toronto Public Health at 416-392-1250. The school does not keep records on individual students.

#### Grade 8 - 9 Transition Information

This is an exciting time for our Grade 8 students as they start exploring their choices for Grade 9. Our parent information evening is taking place on November 6, 2017 @ 6:30pm and the student information assembly will be held on November 7, 2017.

#### **Optional Attendance**

There are a wide variety of options for our Grade 8 students as they transition to secondary school. Under the optional attendance policy, students have the opportunity to apply to 2 regular schools and 2 specialized programs outside their home school.

Optional attendance forms for regular schools will be available from the Guidance Office sometime in December when TDSB publishes a list of schools that are deemed "closed" or "limited".

As per the optional attendance policy, students cannot apply to schools that are deemed "closed". A school deemed "limited" that receives more applications than it has space will run a lottery in the first week of February, 2018 to determine admissions offers; students/parents/guardians will be informed of acceptance by February, 16, 2018.



## OPTIONAL ATTENDANCE

#### Information for Parents/Guardians of Grade 8 Students

- Students may apply to a maximum of two "Regular Schools and Programs" and two "Specialized Schools and Programs" under the Optional Attendance Policy. A separate Optional Attendance Form/application must be submitted for each choice.
- Students may not apply to a secondary school deemed "closed".
- It is the parent's/student's responsibility to take the completed Optional Attendance Form(s) to the appropriate secondary school(s) by: February 2, 2018
- A school deemed "limited" that receives more applications than it has space, will run a "lottery" in the
  first week of February, 2018, to determine admission offers; students/parents/guardians will be
  informed of acceptance no later than February 16, 2018.
- Once a student is offered admission under Optional Attendance, the secondary school will contact the
  parent/guardian and will provide a Grade 9 Course Selection Sheet for completion. Parents/guardians
  are requested to decline any offers they do not intend to accept within three days. To confirm the
  selected offer of admission to the school/program of choice, a completed corresponding Course
  Selection Sheet must be returned to the student's current elementary school before February 23, 2018.
- Once an offer of admission under Optional Attendance is accepted by a parent/student to a selected
  "regular" secondary school, any subsequent request(s) for admission to the "geographic home school"
  or any other school must be initiated ONLY through the Optional Attendance process. The confirmed
  selection becomes the student's official "home school". Please note: subsequent requests under
  Optional Attendance may not result in admission if a school's status has changed due to enrolment.
- Students will be responsible for their own transportation.
