NEWS AND CUES FROM GUIDANCE

Please read this information carefully so that you are aware of the due dates and process for high school selection, course selection and the choice of optional attendance.

Each student will be filling out a paper course selection sheet for their home school and entering the information on myBlueprint. If your child has multiple home schools, they will need to make a decision by January 18th which school they want to apply to. I will meet with each student that has multiple home schools on the 22nd of January to ensure I have the correct course selection sheet for them to fill out.

Each class will be serviced through IT from January 23 to January 26 to complete the paper course selection sheet and complete a draft on myBlueprint.

When they bring their course selections sheet home, go over it carefully, sign it and return it to your child's registration teacher by January 29th. Please check over their draft of myBlueprint online to ensure that the courses chosen on the paper sheet match what has been entered on line. myBlueprint instructions are available on the Glenview Website under the Guidance Tab.

Please **DO NOT** submit or print myBlueprint at home. I will need to check over the paper course selection sheets to make sure they match the myBlueprint selections before submission. Once courses are submitted on myBlueprint, changes cannot be made.

Optional Attendance

We have just received the list of closed schools. Students who are not in district of a closed school can not apply to it under optional attendance. I am attaching this fact sheet to this issue of Parentview. Students can now obtain optional attendance application forms from me to apply to schools that are not closed. They are due to the secondary schools on February 2nd. It is the parent's responsibility to deliver the forms to the secondary school they are applying to.

You will be notified of your status by February 16th. If your child is accepted to an optional attendance school (regular or specialized), they are to bring me verification of the acceptance between February 20 and February 28 so another course selection sheet and myBlueprint submission can be made to replace the home school.

Northern Student Visit: (By Written Permission Only)

January 18: 12:30-3:30

Grade 8 students who are interested in taking part in this visit must pick up a permission form from Ms. Meghji during the week of December 18th and return them to Guidance by January 9th (the second day back from the winter break).

We need to provide numbers to Northern on January 10th for planning purposes. As such, late permission forms will not be accepted.

Students will be dismissed from Glenview at 11:15 to make their way to Northern Secondary School on their own. They will meet Ms. Meghji at 12:20pm for attendance. Once at Northern, they will be escorted by NSS staff and students for the program. They will be dismissed between 3:00 PM and 3:15 PM and will be responsible for their own transportation back home. The evening session is taking place at 6:00 PM for parents and students to attend.

Dear Parent(s)/Guardian(s):

Welcome to an exciting opportunity to participate in a newly funded after school program for students grades 6-8 with Autism Spectrum Disorder (ASD) called **Doing What I Love: At Home, At School and In the Community!** This is a Ministry funded after school program that offers an opportunity for students to develop, build and enhance their skills through leisure activities.

A key component of the program is to learn individualized leisure/recreation activities based on the child's interest. Activities will be co-taught by "experts" in the leisure activities supported by qualified teachers who will reinforce Applied Behaviour Analysis (ABA) Instructional Methods throughout the sessions with students. The program offers simultaneous sessions for parents/guardians that include instruction in leisure activities and strategies being taught to the child in order to practice these leisure activities at home and in the community. Parents will also be provided with information regarding the benefits of leisure activities and how it supports their child's strengths and challenges (e.g., reducing anxiety, overall health benefits, increasing opportunity for engagement in community etc.).

One of the great things about this program is that parents/guardians have the opportunity to participate alongside their child. Parent/Guardian and child can participate in one hour sessions, once a week for 6 weeks. We invite school aged siblings to attend to provide an opportunity for this to be a family event. In addition, child care will be provided for non-school aged children. The program will run for 6 weeks from January 17 to February 21, 2018 from 6:00 p.m. to 7:00 p.m. at the locations listed below.

Participants are invited to sign up for only **one location**.

Learning Center 1 - C R Marchant - 1 Ralph Street, York

Learning Center 2 - Charles H Best Middle School - 285 Wilmington Avenue, North York

Learning Center 3 – Buchanan Public School – 4 Bucannan Road, Scarborough

Learning Center 4 - Nelson Mandela Park Public School - 440 Shuter Street, Toronto

Unfortunately **transportation will not be provided**, so we ask for your commitment to bring your child and attend all sessions with them. Families will have a unique opportunity to access a Leisure Coach to bridge the gap between after school, home and community.

If you are interested, please fill out the attached application and return it to your child's school or teacher by **Thursday, November 30, 2017**. Depending on the number of responses received, students may be selected through a lottery process. This program provides your child with an excellent opportunity to get involved in leisure activities at the school and in the community. The first session will begin on Wednesday, January 17, 2018.
