FROM THE OFFICE

Welcome to the first edition of Parentview for the 2018-2019 school year. Through Parentview you will receive updates regarding important information, news of events, and future dates for what is happening at Glenview. As stated in the information letter sent home on September 7, future issues of Parentview and other communications will be sent home electronically. Please make sure to inform the school of email address changes.

The first three weeks of school have given our former students the opportunity to reconnect with friends and staff, and for our new students to meet new friends and staff while getting used to the new and exciting life of middle school. Our staff are dedicated and collectively have worked very hard to ensure we are off to a great start. We are hoping that the upcoming school year will be a very successful one for all of our students.

Thank you to our Parent Council for funding the Welcome Breakfast last Friday. It was wonderful to see so many familiar faces and to meet new ones. We were very pleased with the number of parents who were able to attend and connect with our staff.

Curriculum Night is scheduled for Thursday, September 27th. The evening will start at 6:30 pm with your child's registration teachers. Throughout the evening you will have opportunities to visit with other teachers/classes. We will finish the evening at 8:00 pm in the gymnasium. You will receive more information electronically by next Wednesday regarding the evening.

A gentle reminder, we expect that students remember to bring their necessary equipment, such as gym uniforms or swim wear. Assessments in these programs rely heavily on participation and all students are expected to participate. We are trying to teach our students that it is their responsibility to be prepared for all classes.

As part of School Improvement Plan, we have already met with our teaching staff to continue to implement the 3 Foci from last year that were developed based on the [TDSB's Vision for Learning](#). Our school goals around Well Being, Equity, and Achievement will be embedded with the work around [Global Competencies](#). This year we will be infusing the classroom Learning Goals with Global Competencies to make the learning more relevant and meaningful for our students and staff.

STUDENT DROP-OFF AND PICK-UP

For safety reasons, we would like to remind our parents to ONLY use the east side of Rosewell Avenue (the side closest to the school) when dropping off or picking up students. Crossing Rosewell Avenue at drop off and pick-up time can be very dangerous. Pylons will be placed at the entrance of the driveway every morning to prevent students from being dropped off in front of the entry doors. It is extremely dangerous for our students when cars are backing up from our driveway. In addition, we continue to notice cars making U-turns on Rosewell Avenue in front of the school which creates another dangerous situation for all. Please make note of the new traffic signs indicating no U-Turns on Rosewell. Thank you to all parents for your support and cooperation!

PHONE USE FOR STUDENTS

In the past, we received numerous and some serious concerns from students, staff and parents regarding inappropriate use of cell phones during the school day. We feel that it is important to share with you our cell phone policy to ensure that the expectations and consequences are clear.

Glenview's rule about cell phone use is very simple. Before the students enter the building, they must power off their cell phones and then store them in their locker until dismissal time at 3:19 p.m. Students do not need to access their cell phone during the day and should not be using them at lunch time, in their classes, in the hallways or in the washrooms. If parents need to reach their child between 9:01 a.m. and 3:19 p.m. they are asked to please contact our office at 416-393-9390, and a message will be relayed to their child. Please do not call or text your child during the day. Students have been informed not to text from 9:01 a.m. until 3:19 p.m.

If a student is caught using his/her cell phone during school hours, the student will be asked to power it off and it will remain in the office until the end of the day. When a student's phone is confiscated, it will be placed in our office and they will be asked to sign off on our tracking sheet. If this happens a second time, parents will be asked to come in to retrieve it; it will not be handed back to the student. We understand that this policy may be an inconvenience for parents and students alike, however, compliance with this request is asked from the Glenview community, otherwise these rules will not be adhered to.

Welcome back to school. My name is Nishi Meghji. I am excited to join Glenview as the Elementary Counsellor and look forward to working with students and families.

My goal is to keep students and parents informed of all things guidance at Glenview.

The Guidance program is designed to help students develop the knowledge and skills they need to make informed education and career/life choices through the effective application of a four-step inquiry process where students will explore the following four questions:

Who am I?

What are my opportunities?

What do I want to become?

What is my plan for achieving my goals?

In addition to helping students plan for the future, we are here to foster and support their emotional, social and academic well-being. Our goal is for every student to feel comfortable and safe at school.

How to Make an Appointment

- Students will be completing course selection (hard copies & online using myBlueprint) with me in January. Further information will be shared with parents as we get closer to this date.

Student Council

This year we have modified the selection process for student council positions. The student council is an organization of students who work towards improving their school and community. Our Student Council will be made up of 28 Class Representatives. Students who are interested in becoming a class representative are invited to pick up a Student Council Representative Application from their registration teacher between October 1 and October 3. **Completed applications are due to the Registration Teacher on October 4.**

The registration teacher will use the application to determine eligibility. Each eligible student who wants to be elected will give a brief 1-2 minute speech to his/her classmates as to why they would be a good representative for their class.

The teacher will determine the day of the speeches and voting.

Registration teachers will tally the votes and submit the name of their class's representative to Ms. Meghji by **4:00 p.m. on October 12, 2018.**

Grade 8 Class Reps will be given the opportunity for extra leadership by running for 6 Executive Positions. Executive position selection will be based on a written application and interview by a teacher committee.

Details of this process will be shared with students at the 1st School Wide Assembly taking place on September 28.

Dear Parents/Guardians,

For the last three years, Ontario's school boards have been required to use the updated 2015 Health and Physical Education Curriculum (HPEC) in both elementary and high schools. As you may know, the Ministry of Education recently directed all school boards across the province to use the re-issued 2010 HPEC (Grades 1-8) as of this September. Secondary teachers will continue to teach the 2015 HPEC - the secondary school curriculum will not be changing from the 2015 HPEC. The Ministry of Education has the right to set curriculum for Ontario students and the TDSB expects teachers to use the re-issued 2010 HPEC (Grades 1-8) for the coming school year.

You can learn about the re-issued 2010 HPEC (Grades 1-8) by visiting the Ministry's [2010 HPEC-Grades 1-8](#). Based on a preliminary review of the re-issued 2010 HPEC (Grades 1-8) by Board staff, while the wording may be different than the 2015 curriculum, the 2010 curriculum still contains many critically important topics. However, some areas of the 2015 version may not be specifically included or included but at a different grade level. That's why Board staff have prepared information to help you understand what can be taught and when. The information will also help you understand the differences between the 2015 curriculum and the re-issued 2010 HPEC (Grades 1-8) in the classroom. This information can be found at www.tdsb.on.ca/HPEC2010.

At the same time, we have provided resources for our teachers that will assist them to deliver the appropriate HPEC. I am confident our teachers will continue to deliver the provided curriculum in ways that meet the Ministry direction, and create a learning environment for students that is safe, inclusive and focused on their success and well-being.

Going forward should you have any questions or concerns about how the curriculum will be or is being taught in your child's classroom, we encourage you to speak with your child's teacher, who can help answer your questions and usually resolve any concerns. In rare instances where this isn't the case, we recommend parents follow the [TDSB Parent Concern Protocol](#) which may involve sharing your concerns with the school's Principal or Superintendent.

As noted above, the Ministry of Education requires school boards to use the re-issued 2010 HPEC. Parents who have concerns about the re-issued 2010 HPEC (Grades 1-8) itself should direct concerns to the Ministry of Education at www.edu.gov.on.ca; see the Contact Us options on the right side of the webpage.

The Ontario government will be reviewing the Health and Physical Education Curriculum (Grades 1-8) and will be consulting with parents. Once consultation details are available, we will be providing parents with that information.


