Roots of Empathy in Room 117

Roots of Empathy is a program which focuses on raising levels of empathy among school children. resulting in more respectful and caring relationships. An infant and parent visit the classroom every 3 weeks over the school year and a trained Roots of Empathy instructor coaches the students to observe the baby's development and to label the baby's feelings. The baby is the "Teacher" which the instructor uses to help children identify and reflect on their own feelings. We are so lucky at Gracedale to have Ms. Sasso as a trained Roots of Empathy facilitator. She and Mrs. Kaushal have started this program in room 117 with the Kindergarten children. During the first meeting on November 30th the children met baby Yameenaa and learned how they will interact with her. Thank you so much to Mom Layla and sister Shafaq who is a member of the class.
