- Make sure that you explain to your child that you always want the truth, even though he or she may be afraid that you might be angry.
- Encourage and praise your child when he/she is honest.
- Model honesty by returning lost items.

P.A.L.S. at Gracedale!

Mrs. Pereira and Mrs. Nagra will be working with Grade 4 and 5 students to start the P.A.L.S program at Gracedale. Playground Activity Leaders in Schools (PALS) is a leadership program. It provides leadership opportunities for students as students lead physical activities at lunch and recess. The program has been shown to decrease conflict and reduce the incidence of playground bullying. A Public Health Nurse will train the students to implement P.A.L.S. Students from the Junior classrooms will be trained and then work with younger children at lunch and recess.



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International Day for the Elimination of Racial Discrimination

The International Day for the Elimination of Racial Discrimination, March 21, commemorates the anniversary of the Sharpeville Massacre. Forty-three years ago in South Africa, peaceful anti-apartheid protesters were killed. In 1966, the United Nations declared that each year on March 21, this day should be observed as a symbol of the world-wide need to end racism. Canada is a country of which we can be proud. But our pride is diminished when we do not use our individual and collective voices to oppose racism. March 21st reminds us to
