French Programs in the TDSB



For families interested in the Toronto District School Board's French Immersion or Extended French programs, we offer an online process for applying to:

- Early French Immersion (EFI) which begins in Senior Kindergarten;
- Junior Extended French (JEF) which begins in Grade 4

At this time, we guarantee an offer of placement in the program (not a specific school) to all on-time applicants. The timelines for applying for these programs for September 2020 are:

- Applications for **Early French Immersion** (for a Junior Kindergarten aged child), must be completed online between **November 4, 2019 and November 29, 2019**.



Drop Off Loop @ Halbert!

To support students' safe entry, we have one staff member who is assigned to the parking lot drop off. The purpose of the drop off area is to support families who are not parking but are just dropping off their children.

We ask for your support and patience. We have room for two cars at the drop off point at one time. We wish for the students to be dropped off in front of the yellow gate to minimize the number of students walking through the parking lot during peak times.

There is a staff member at the drop off point ready to welcome your child and ensure they enter the playground safely.



Lost Items

There are many items in our Lost and Found located by the piano outside of the Kindergarten classroom. We invite families, when they are at school, to check out the box to see if there are any items in there belonging to their children.

We invite families to label pieces of clothing as many items get mixed up right after recesses as students remove their outdoor gear in the same vicinity.

Likewise, we invite families to see if their children have inadvertently taken other students' items home (e.g., sweaters, snow pants, gloves). If so, kindly return them to the Office as we do have families who are in search of lost items.

Gloves, Scarves, Hats: We invite students to place their gloves, scarves and hats (unless they are really wet) in the sleeves of their coats so that they are easily accessible when preparing for the outdoors.

Students in Rooms 1, 2 and 3 learned about 'chauvres souris" or bats during the week leading up to Halloween!


Their written explanation are impressive! Please drop and by and read them when you can!

Thank you to Ms. Van Evera for this amazing life sized bulletin board! We will be taking photos of each child encouraging all to be the I in KIND.




On Remembrance Day we welcomed Sgt. B. Nip (Ret.) of the Queen's York Rangers!
