STUDENT EXAMINATION INSTRUCTIONS

Starting Time and Location of Exam

- Exams begin at 9:00 a.m. or 1:00 p.m. Exam room locations will be posted outside the Main Office and at the Crossroads (entrance to the Mall area).

Students are reminded to:

- Know the date, time and room for each of your exams. Plan your schedule so that you are on time for each examination.
- Arrive at the exam room on time (approximately 10 minutes ahead).
- Bring only your writing implements to the exam room and the course text if not yet returned.
- Leave all backpacks, jackets, pencil cases and any other materials in locker or at the front of the room.
- Cell phones and other electronic devices including ear buds must be turned off, put away, be out of sight, and not accessible to the student.
- Come prepared with pens, pencils, erasers, rulers, non-programmable, non-graphing calculator (as instructed by subject teacher) etc. Calculators may not be shared. All paper will be supplied in the exam room.
- Students are required to remain in the exam for the first hour of the exam. Additionally, students will not be able to leave the exam in the last 15 minutes to minimize disruption.

Students Missing an Exam

- If you are absent for an exam due to serious illness, you must provide medical documentation. No one is exempt from exams.
- If a student or parent does not communicate with a Vice-Principal and the teacher about a missed final exam, the student will automatically receive a mark of zero.
- Any absence due to extenuating circumstances must be documented by a medical certificate or other official document and approved by a vice-principal. Neither vacation time nor employment is a valid reason for missing an exam.
- **This medical certificate must clearly state that the student named was unable to attend school and write their exam on the specific date(s) due to illness. Medical certificates must be received in the Main Office before noon on Friday, January 24th, 2025.**

Students late for an Exam

- Students arriving up to 15 minutes late for an exam will be allowed to write the exam, however, **NO ADDITIONAL TIME WILL BE PERMITTED.**
- Students arriving later than 15 minutes must report to the Vice Principal's office and speak to one of the Vice Principals.
- Students with one exam are expected to leave the school immediately after their examination has been written, or they may study quietly in the mall/cafeteria. The Mall & Cafeteria will be open 9 – 12 on exam days for quiet study time only.

Accommodations (Special Education and ESL)

Students with Special Education accommodations will write their exams in the Library. This is pre-arranged with Ms. Williams. Students with ESL Accommodations will write in Room 215. This has also been prearranged by Ms. Michael.

Academic Honesty

Students will not have access to any unauthorized materials or digital devices which might assist them in writing the exam. Students who are caught cheating will be given a mark of ZERO for the exam and may be subject to other disciplinary actions. Some examples of cheating include:

- Using another student's work on the exam
- Bringing unauthorized notes or notation into an exam
- Giving or Asking someone an answer during an exam
- Unauthorized use of electronic media to obtain or attempt to obtain answers during the exam. **Study well and good luck on your exams!**
