With exams starting next week on Wednesday, January 25th in the afternoon, I wanted to send another communication to highlight some important exam information as well as other items — including a couple of wonderful Harbord student activities. CREDIT RESCUE WEEK

Credit Rescue Week is happening in Room 228 during all exam period days, from the afternoon of January 25 - the morning of January 31. (See the attached schedule to the email) It is intended for students who need some extra support to complete an assignment or prepare for an examination in order to earn the credit in one or more of their courses. When a teacher is concerned about a student earning the credit, that teacher will speak with the student and request that they attend Credit Rescue on either a specific day (when a specialist teacher is present, consistent with the attached schedule) or on any day that works with the student's schedule. STUDENT EXAM INSTRUCTIONS

Attached to the email are important exam instructions for students. Please read over the information carefully in advance of your first exam. Remember that we have a special schedule for the morning of January 25, 2023:

Tutorial Morning Schedule Period 1 - 9:00 a.m. - 9:35 a.m. Period 2 - 9:40 a.m. - 10:15 a.m. Period 3 - 10:20 a.m. - 10:55 a.m. Period 4 - 11:00 a.m. - 11:35 a.m.

The first block of <u>exams start on Wednesday</u>, January 25, 2023 at 1pm. During the exam period, students are only required to come to school for their scheduled exam (or for Credit Rescue). If you or your child have any questions, please contact your child's teacher via email.

Also, students are reminded to please return textbooks to your teachers. Textbooks are integral to our learning and are VERY EXPENSIVE. Unnecessarily replacing textbooks takes away school funds from school activities, school equipment, and other important learning materials. For courses with exams, students are to bring the textbook to the exam and return them to the presiding teacher. For courses without exams, they are to return them directly to the classroom teacher during the last days of the course. Please help your child understand the importance of returning textbooks and the unnecessary associated costs of purchasing replacements.

GRADE 12 BIOLOGY CLASS BIOTECH LAB — so much fun!

For the past week, our Grade 12 Bio students have been applying what they learned in the Molecular Genetics unit in an extended series of biotechnology labs. The goal for our students was to mimic the process of using bacteria to clone the gene for insulin! Students created recombinant plasmids that contain a gene from a sea anemone that codes for a red fluorescent protein. Once the recombinant plasmids were created, they inserted them into bacterial hosts. As those bacteria grew and reproduced, they cloned the gene! Students then created the conditions for them to express the protein and voila, the bacteria glowed pink! This FUNomenal learning is all part of the Amgen Biotech Experience run in partnership with the University of Toronto's Mississauga campus.
