If class sizes remain high through the end of September, we may be splitting classes and receiving additional staffing. - Every single student should enroll in our Guidance Google Classroom. It's through this Classroom that we deliver info and reminders about things like Night/Summer School, workshops, scholarships, grade 12 info, post-secondary deadlines, volunteer/job opportunities etc.

#### Timetable Changes

- The only changes that can be considered for sem I are those due to errors, summer school achievement, missing prerequisites, and SPECIFIC courses required for post-secondary programs.
- Rather than waiting in long lines outside our office, we've created a Course Change Form that students should fill out by September 11th. The form generates an email to parents asking for permission.
- We're working as fast as we can to call down students for whom we have permission to make a timetable change.
- Changes at this point are very tricky as many of our classes are full, however we will try our best!
- Students will have all of sem I (Sept. 25-Jan. 22) to speak with counsellors about sem II timetable changes.

#### Night School/eLearning

- Reminder that the registration for both <u>eLearning</u> and <u>ConEd/Night School</u> is open. eLearning reg closes Sept 22 and ConEd/Night School registration closes Sept. 29
- Parent permission is required before we can approve the enrollment.

#### Stay Connected With Harbord with Two New Communication Tools

The TDSB is offering two new ways for parents and caregivers to stay connected with their school and the TDSB.

- 1. Parents and caregivers will also be provided an opportunity to opt in to receive text messages from their school and TDSB. A text message will be sent to you to the phone number you have on file in September inviting you to opt in.
- 2. Using the <u>School Messenger</u> app or website provides a faster and easier way to report absences directly to our school information system (no need to call the school!) and receive communication sent by the TDSB and your school (this will also go to the email that you have on file). #### Camp Robin Hood Grade 9 Cooperative Activities and Leadership Day

As part of our Harbord tradition every year, we are taking our grade 9 students on a one day field trip to Camp Robin Hood Leadership Centre in Markham, Ontario on Thursday, September 14, 2023. Our grade 9 students will participate in adventure-based, co-operative and recreational activities. All of the activities promote the development of lifelong abilities and skills, such as problem solving, trust building, teamwork, communication, perseverance, social skills, experiential learning and spirit! This 'fun-filled' trip will also provide our grade 9 students with opportunities to connect, get to know their peers, and feel more comfortable with each other — and part of our Harbord family. **The field trip form can be accessed via the Excursion Management Application (EMA), a web-based application which allows Parents/Guardians to complete and submit field trip (or excursion) permission, athletic forms and Medical Information forms online. Grade 9 families are asked to complete the EMA field trip permission form and submit as soon as possible. We expect all grade 9 students to attend this day. There is NO cost to the students and lunch is provided (Harbord is paying for all costs). If parents are having difficulty accessing and completing the permission form on EMA, a PDF copy of the field trip has been provided to your child. All completed forms must be submitted via EMA online or the paper copy to the main office by 9am on Tuesday, September 12, 2023. Completion via EMA is strongly preferred.

#### 1:1 Student Device Program (Grade 9's)

The 1:1 Student Device Program continues for the third year in 2023-24. Current year grade 9 Harbord students will be receiving Chromebooks at the end of September. A signed agreement will be required by the parent/guardian of each student prior to obtaining a device. #### School Councils – General information

School Councils work to improve student achievement and to enhance the accountability of the education system. They are governed by the Ontario Ministry of Education Regulations 612 and 613, which contains very clear guidelines regarding School Council elections. Regulation 612 outlines the roles, the responsibilities and the processes for School Councils. Regulation 613 outlines the responsibility of the Principal in supporting School Councils. As collaborators in education, schools and School Councils recognize that all parents/caregivers have an equitable place in our schools' community, free from racism, classism, and other isms, intentional or unintentional. There is an understanding that participation can take many forms and work to:

- offer parents/caregivers a variety of ways to share their voices, knowledge and expertise;
- recognize that relationship building is key to breaking down walls and barriers;
- strive to identify and to eliminate barriers to participation for parents/caregivers
- disrupt practices that contribute to oppression based on race, class, nationality, abilities, gender, education, or language.
