## Hello Harbord parents/guardians and students:

Going to keep this one short!

Our school has been working with our partners at Women's College Hospital and we've set up a vaccination clinic at Harbord CI on Friday Oct. 15 from 2:30pm – 6pm in the cafeteria (see attached flyer). In addition to the vaccination clinic on Friday Oct. 15, a WCH doctor will come by the school on Tuesday, October 12th from 12:30pm – 2:30pm and will join me on classroom visits (for 5 min. in each class) to answer questions and provide some information about frequently asked questions relating to the COVID-19 vaccine.

Also, our Toronto Public Health nurse has provided the school with a new resource that's just been made available: the <a href="COVID-19 Vaccine Consult Service">COVID-19 Vaccine Consult Service</a>. This phone-based service is staffed by pediatric RNs. It might be helpful for our parents or students who need more information about the benefits/risks of vaccination and a place to consult around medical conditions and if they are compatible with vaccination (such as students with chronic illness). This is the <a href="Link for parents or students">Link for parents or students to self-book appointments</a> The consults are offered by phone and appointments are often available that same day at convenient times. Here's some information from their website —

"The SickKids COVID-19 Vaccine Consult Service is a by-appointment phone service that provides a safe, judgement-free space to have an open conversation about the COVID-19 vaccine for children and youth. It is available in multiple languages, using over-the-phone language interpretation.

We are here to support residents of Ontario 12 years or older and their parents, caregivers or legal guardians who:

- Have specific questions or concerns related to the COVID-19 vaccine for youth/children that you cannot find the answer to elsewhere.
- Have complex medical histories or medical conditions (i.e. chronic illness) and/or their parents/caregivers.
- Require additional support for their COVID-19 vaccine due to medical complexity, developmental disorder or mobility, communication, behavioural or other specialized needs, including significant needle phobia.

As you can see, we are all working TOGETHER to keep us safe and healthy (and doing everything we can to keep our "school-home" open and operational). Please continue to practice the health and safety protocols and follow the most up-to-date Toronto Public Health directives --- especially this long weekend.
