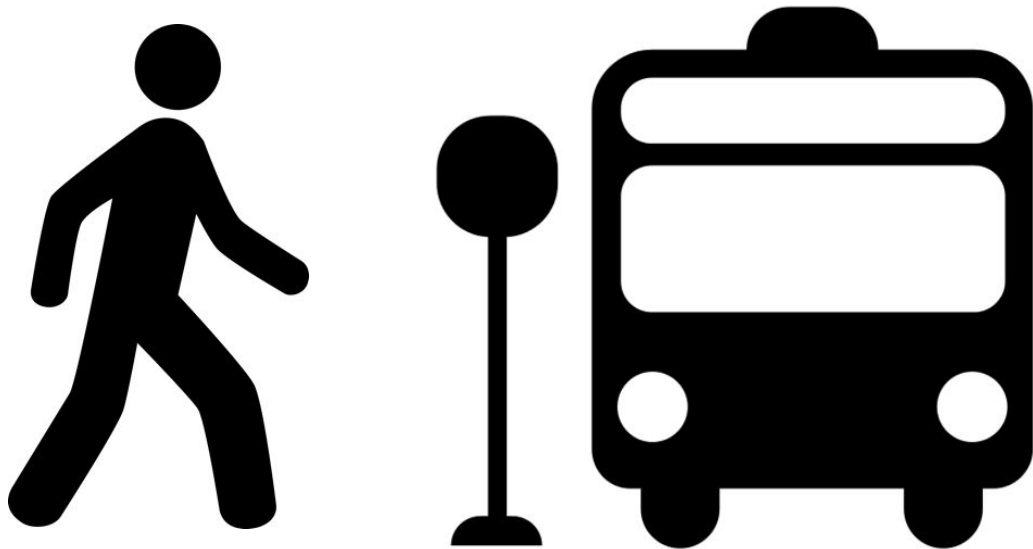

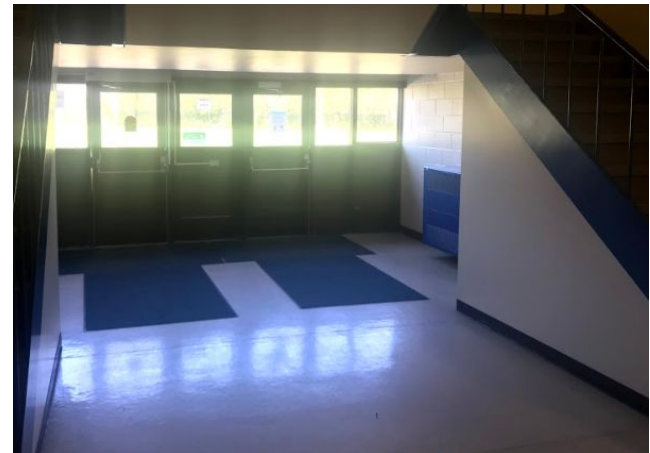
ARRIVAL

- 500 min/week - 10 Core Periods (50 mins each)

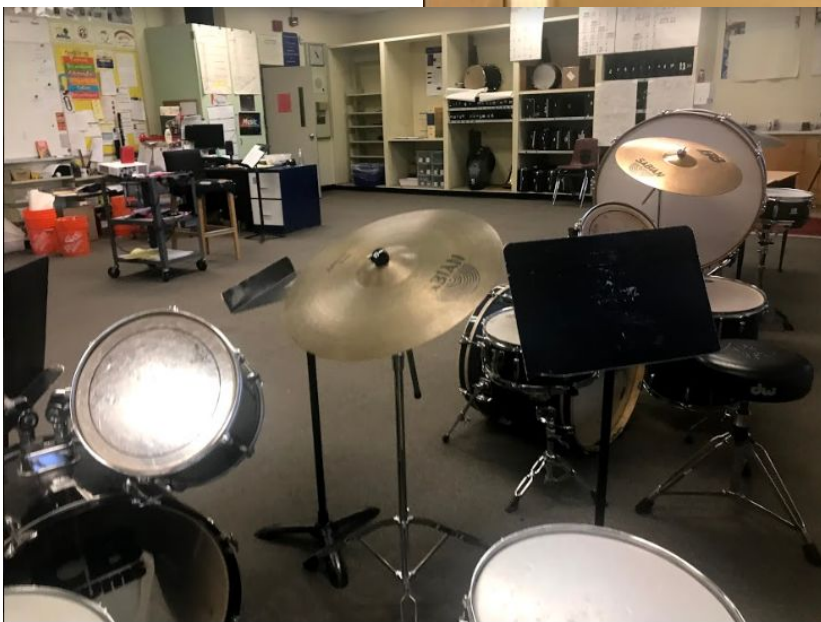
Characteristics of Successful Extended French Students:

- A generally competent student

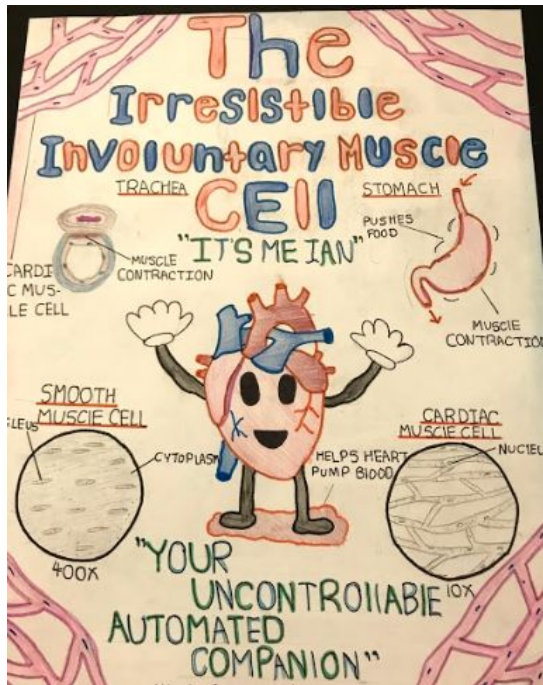

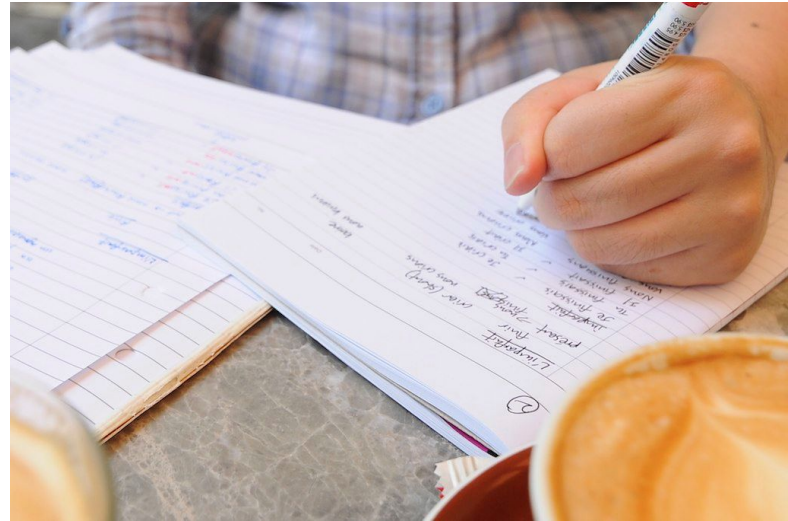
What can I expect in Grade 7?

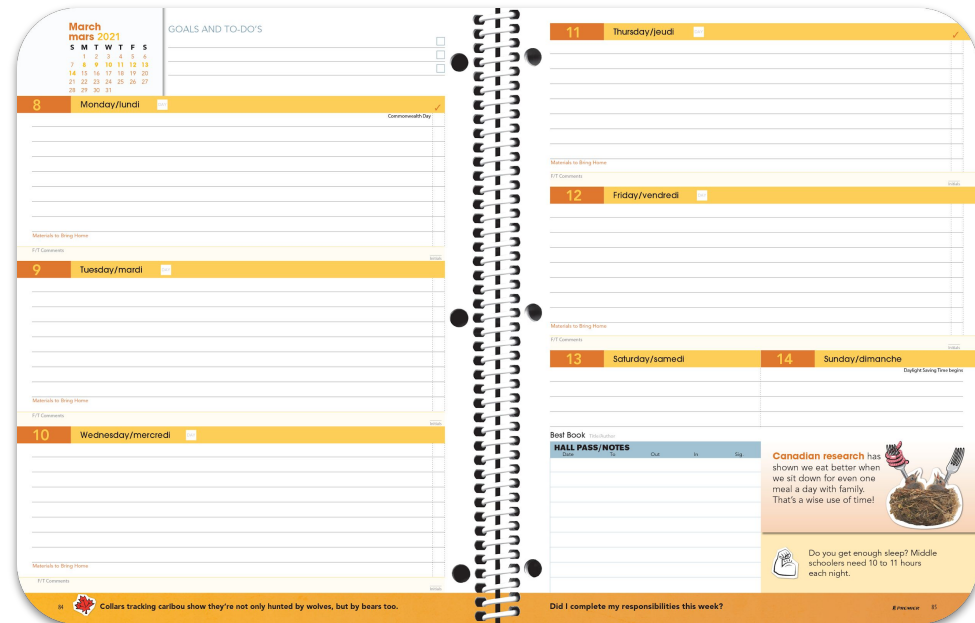

Be Responsible for your LOCKER

Students will be assigned a locker for classroom materials and personal belongings.

□ **ONLY COMBINATION LOCKS WILL BE PERMITTED**

- Can be purchased at Hudson (September)

□ In order to protect your personal belongings you must

- 1) **Never tell anyone your combination number**
- 2) **Keep locker locked at all times when not in use**
- 3) **Leave jewellery and valuables at home.**



LOCKERS

□ Lockers will be inspected from time to time in order to ensure cleanliness or, if there is reasonable suspicion about its proper use.

□ The use of a locker is a privilege, and it must be treated accordingly.

CELL PHONES

Cell phones are not permitted to be used during the school day, without permission.

Students may power off and keep their cell phones in their locker during the school day (8:45 am – 3:00 pm) without issue.

PHYSICAL EDUCATION UNIFORM

Physical Education is a required part of the student's timetable and full participation is expected. For safety and hygienic reasons a complete change of clothing is required.

Both new and gently used gym uniforms are available for purchase from the school **in September**.

It is expected the uniform will be washed regularly. Students are also expected to provide 'gym-use' only shoes and socks.

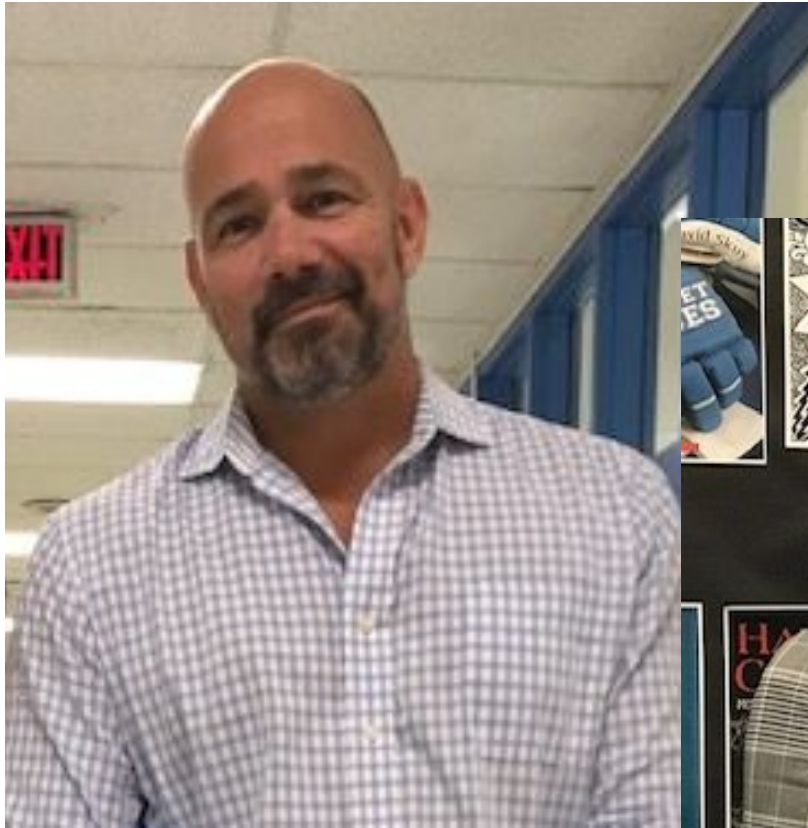

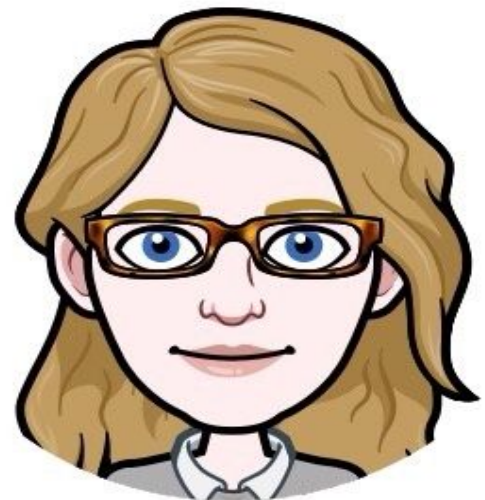


Hi everyone. My name is Ms Irene. I work in the DD room at Henry Hudson. I can't wait to meet you in September as we start our journey together.

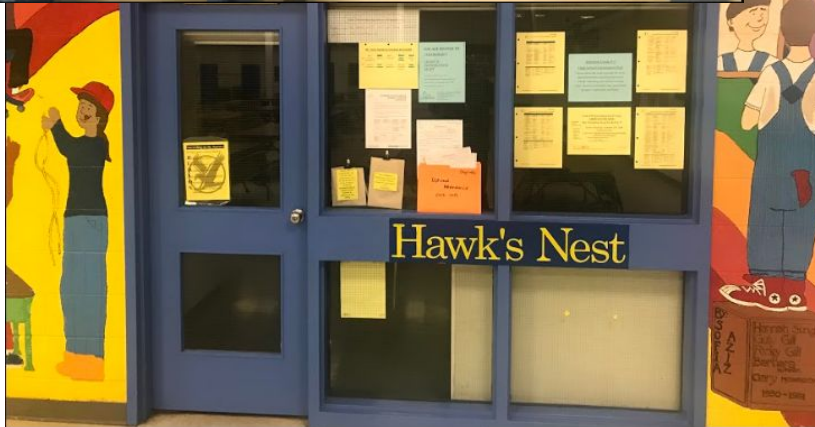
