From Toronto Public Health:

COVID-19 Screening before Students come to School

Every student must complete a COVID-19 screening before coming to school each day. Toronto Public Health has a COVID-19 screening questionnaire for students JK to Grade 12 that you can use. If your child has one or more symptoms of COVID-19:

- Keep your child home, even if the symptoms are mild.
- Siblings and other children in the home must also stay home.
- Arrange for your child to get tested or contact your health care provider.
- Without testing, your child and their siblings must stay home for 10 days. A doctor's note is not needed for return to school.
- Monitor your family for symptoms. Adults must stay home if they have one or more symptoms.

Important Reminders for Parents while Toronto is in the Grey Zone

While Toronto is in the Grey Zone, here are some important reminders for parents:

- Do not schedule playdates even among students in the same class cohort.
- Make use of outdoor recreational amenities like playgrounds, tobogganing hills, fitness equipment and designated off-leash dog parks, but only with people you live with.
- Stay two metres away from people that you don't live with.

It is important for students to wear their masks when they are in school. Wearing a mask along with physical distancing and other public health measures can reduce the spread of COVID-19. When we all wear a mask to cover our respiratory droplets it provides source control to reduce the spread of germs into the air and on surfaces. Teach your child the proper use of masks and how to safely put on and take off a mask.

Photo Day

We have scheduled a photo day for both in-person and Virtual School students. This day is Monday, March 29th. Our photographer, Edge Imaging, has strict Covid-19 protocols. They will only be taking individual photos. Group class photos will not be taken this year. In-person students will have photos taken during the school day. Virtual School students will be able to sign up online for an appointment after school, to ensure that cohorts do not mix. Information on how to access the sign-up portal will be sent out to Virtual School families shortly.

Kindergarten Registration 2020

Registration for all TDSB Kindergarten programs began in February. We continue to accept registrations for students living in the Hillmount Public School catchment area. The deadline for Optional Attendance applications has passed.

To attend Junior Kindergarten in September, children must turn four years old by December 31. To register for Senior Kindergarten, children must be five years old by December 31. You may choose to register in person at the school or begin this process online.

Student Safety! Parking and Pick-Ups

The best way for students to get to school is to walk. This allows for fresh air and exercise and keeps the roads around the school safe. Crossing guards can assist you and your children in arriving safely at school when walking.

• Hillmount's parking lot is intended for use by TDSB and daycare staff only.

- There are a limited number of parking spots for parents who are dropping off students.
- Kiss and ride zone is located in the first part of the circular driveway, no cars should be parked in that area
- Do not stop in front of the marked pedestrian crossing

Kiss and Ride means that the driver remains in the car and the student gets out. IF YOU MUST GET OUT OF THE CAR, AND YOU CANNOT FIND A MARKED SPOT IN THE PARKING LOT, PLEASE PARK ON A

SIDE STREET. We encourage parents of students in Grades 1-5 to use the Kiss and Ride. Students are supervised from 8:40 a.m. and at 3:30 until 3:45, at which time they will be taken to the office.

- Street parking is available —please note the times posted on the signs and be respectful of our neighbours.
- Do not walk students through the parking lot. Use the path and marked crossing area by the circular driveway.

CHANK YOU! Please do your part to keep traffic moving smoothly and to keep all of Hillmount's students and families safe.

Below are some surprising statistics about dangerous behaviours in school zones:

- Nearly a quarter of drivers reported witnessing a near miss or collision in a school zone, more than half of which involved a child (CAA polling, 2019).
- Nearly 1/2 of Canadians say they witnessed a distracted driver in a school zone (CAA polling, 2019).
- During Ottawa Police's week long blitz focused on traffic safety in and around school zones they issued 504 tickets to drivers for the following infractions; speeding in school zones, failing to stop, failing to yield to pedestrians at school crossings, failing to obey crossing guards, failing to obey school bus signs, and distracted driving (Ottawa Police, 2017).
- In Edmonton more than 106,000 tickets were issued to drivers speeding in school zones during the 2014-2015 school year (Edmonton Police, 2016).

Please be careful when you are driving around our school or in our parking lot. Let's work together to keep our children safe.



DRESS FOR THE WEATHER

Part of the daily program for all grades at Hillmount is outdoor time. Students are outside at least 3 times a day. Students should come dressed appropriately for the weather. If it is raining, students should have rainboots, a raincoat and umbrella. For cold weather, a warm jacket, hat and mittens, along with boots and snowpants are necessary. Dressing for the weather allows students to be comfortable, dry and warm when they are outside, as part of our regular day.



Indoor Shoes

Please make sure your child has indoor shoes at school at all times. We continue to experience wet and muddy conditions outside and students are asked to change their footwear when they enter the school in order to keep their feet dry and warm and to keep the hallways clear of snow and dirt. Indoor shoes should be proper shoes with soles, should be appropriate for gym class and not be slippers for safety purposes.



EXTRA CLOTHING

When playing outside, students often come in with wet socks, pants or shirts. We strongly recommend that you leave a full change of clothing in your child's backpack (for all grades JK-Grade 5), so that we do not have to call you during the day to bring a change of clothing for your child.



TOYS and BELONGINGS from HOME

In a normal school year, we discourage students from bringing toys, electronics and other personal belongings from home. The school cannot be responsible for lost or stolen items. Due to Covid-19, it is essential that all toys and personal items remain at home. There has been an increase in Pokemon cards, make-up, toys and books coming to school. If children take these things out at recess, there is a possibility that other children may touch them, increasing the risk of Covid-19. Please speak to your children about this and remind them not to bring any items from home.

Thank you for helping us to prevent the spread of Covid-19.

Grade 5 Farewell:

The TDSB has made the difficult decision that all grade 8 and grade 12 graduations and grade 5 and 6 farewell ceremonies for the 2020-2021 school year, are to take place virtually. While we do not know what will be possible in June, planning these events take time and effort and the board has wanted to give us as much notice as possible. This means that our Grade 5 Farewell ceremony for this year will take place virtually. We will begin to work on it and more information about the time and format of this event will be shared in the coming months. The ceremony will include both bricks and mortar and virtual school students.



Many of us love our furry friends, however, for some of our students, dogs can be a source of anxiety and discomfort. In addition, when our neighbours bring them onto school property and do not pick up after them, we have problems. For the safety and well-being of all of our Hillmount students and staff, we ask that you obey the signage on the property (and local by-laws) by not bringing your dog to school. If you must walk your dog to pick-up and drop-off your child, please leave your dog off of the school property when coming to collect your children.
