

# **Kindergarten Registration 2022**

Registration for all TDSB Kindergarten programs began in February. We continue to accept registrations for students living in the Hillmount Public School catchment area. The deadline for Optional Attendance applications has passed.

To attend Junior Kindergarten in September, children must turn four years old by December 31. To register for Senior Kindergarten, children must be five years old by December 31. You must register online.

### **Student Safety! Parking and Pick-Ups**

We thank the families that walk to school, which is the best way for students to get to school. There is absolutely no space in our parking lot for parent parking. Any cars that do not belong to child care staff or school staff will be tagged and/towed. This includes unmarked spots by the garbage bin or in the driveway. If your child is not in Kindergarten, your car should not be coming into the parking lot unless you are waiting in the Kiss and Ride.

I continue to observe extremely unsafe actions in the parking lot. I implore you, for the safety of the students, to please ensure the following:

- ♦ Students in Grades 1-5 should be dropped off in the Kiss and Ride zone. There is no need for parents to park and walk students to entry doors. There is supervision provided from 8:40-8:55.
- ♦ Kiss and ride zone is located in the circular driveway, in front of the gym. NO cars should be parked or stopped in that marked area without a driver.
- Do not drop students in the middle of the parking lot and do not walk through the parking lot.
- ♦ Do not stop in front of the marked pedestrian crossing.
- Parents of Kindergarten students can park in the limited spaces in the circular driveway ONLY (please see the <u>Drop off</u>
   and <u>Pick Up Zones map</u>) -please ensure that your car is pulled over as far as possible so that cars using the Kiss and
   Ride can get by

If you choose to use the KISS and RIDE, we appreciate your patience. You may have to wait in line to drop off and pick up your child. If you are in a rush, do not pull your car into the parking lot. Park on the side street and walk to get your child.

#### DRESS FOR THE WEATHER

Part of the daily program for all grades at Hillmount is outdoor time. Students are outside at least 3 times a day. Students should come dressed appropriately for the weather. If it is raining, students should have rainboots, a raincoat and umbrella. For cold weather, a warm jacket, hat and mittens, along with boots and snow pants are necessary. Dressing for the weather allows students to be comfortable, dry and warm when they are outside, as part of our regular day.



#### **Indoor Shoes**

Please make sure your child has indoor shoes at school at all times. Students are asked to change their footwear when they enter the school in order to keep their feet dry and warm and to keep the hallways clear of snow and dirt. Indoor shoes should be proper shoes with soles, should be appropriate for gym class and not be slippers for safety purposes.



#### EXTRA CLOTHING

When playing outside, students often come in with wet socks, pants or shirts. We strongly recommend that you leave a full change of clothing in your child's backpack (for all grades JK-Grade 5), so that we do not have to call you during the day to bring a change of clothing for your child.



#### DOGS

Many of us love our furry friends, however, for some of our students, dogs can be a source of anxiety and discomfort. In addition, when our neighbours bring them onto school property and do not pick up after them, we have problems. For the safety and well-being of all of our Hillmount students and staff, we ask that you obey the signage on the property (and local by-laws) by not bringing your dog to school. If you must walk your dog to pick-up and drop-off your child, please leave your dog off of the school property when coming to collect your children.

#### COVID-19 Testing:

The Ministry of Education has provided our school with additional Rapid Antigen Tests. These tests are to be used for students and staff members who are experiencing symptoms of Covid-19. At Hillmount, we have had 5 reported positive cases of Covid-19 in students. These students have been in two cohorts. As a result, many of the students in the cohorts may have used the 2 rapid tests that were

distributed to all students in January. Every student in the Grade 4/5 cohort and Kindergarten cohort have received 2 additional rapid tests. All other tests will be held in the school office and will be distributed by request as needed. If your child is experiencing symptoms of Covid-19 and you require an additional rapid test, please contact the office and we can make arrangements to get the test to you.

We also have over 100 Saliva PCR tests associated with Sick Kids. If you require a PCR test, please contact the office. Sick Kids is no longer collecting the PCR tests at our school. All samples can be dropped off at collections sites listed below.
