## Class Placements - 2024/2025 SCHOOL YEAR

As we head into the final months of the 2024/2025 school year, the planning and organization process for next September is already underway. As with past practice, we want to reassure parents that the staff and administration put a great deal of time and thought into the organization of classroom groupings each year. Instructional needs and social/emotional needs are all carefully considered. Teachers meet with the school administration to discuss the needs of each student.

**Due to the complex nature of this task, we are not able to entertain requests for specific teachers and/or friends.** We must take into account The Ministry of Education's Primary Class Size which places a 'hard cap' of 20 students in Primary classes (Gr.1 – Gr. 3). We do our best to create an optimal learning environment for

We appreciate your trust in our professional judgement in balancing the considerations mentioned above. **Once again, specific requests for teachers will not be considered.**

### Dance-a-Thon 2024


