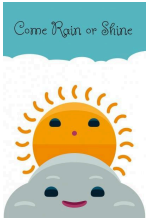

Asian Heritage Month

Asian Heritage Month has been proudly recognized at the Toronto District School Board during the month of May since 2007. This heritage is also celebrated by the Province of Ontario with the royal ascent of the [Asian Heritage Act](#), 2005 and across Canada since May 2002 when the federal Senate adopted a motion to officially designate May as Asian Heritage Month in Canada.

This year's theme for May 2024 was selected by the Asian Heritage Month Volunteer Planning Committee as *Our Journeys: Thriving Through Struggle and Triumph*.

The TDSB is the largest and one of the most diverse school boards in Canada. Nearly one-quarter of our students were born outside of Canada and collectively we speak more than 120 languages. According to the 2023 Student Census 46% of TDSB students self-identified as Asian.

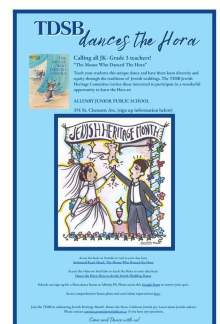
Jewish Heritage Month

Jewish Heritage Month continues to be recognized at the Toronto District School Board (TDSB) during the month of May.

The [Canadian Jewish Heritage Act](#), which was passed in May 2018, is also recognized by the Province of Ontario by the passing of the [Jewish Heritage Month Act](#), 2012. As stated the Jewish Heritage Month Act, 2012, "*May is a significant month for the Jewish Canadian community. Israeli Independence Day (Yom ha-Atzmaut) and Holocaust Remembrance Day (Yom ha-Shoah) frequently occur in May, as do various Jewish artistic and cultural events.*"

The TDSB's Jewish Heritage Committee (JHC) is made up of close to 350 staff across every level of the system as well as Trustees.

Since its inception in 2015, JHC activities have always been focused on teaching & learning in celebration of Jewish heritage and culture – impactful, innovative, and inspirational work with students in fighting
