Progress Reports and/or the Kindergarten Communication of Learning will be sent home with students on Wednesday November 15. The Progress Report Card:

- encourages early and ongoing communication between you and your child's teacher
- tells you how well your child is developing the six learning skills and work habits
- reports on all academic subjects such as language, math, social studie or science and technology but instead of assigning a grade or mark, it will tell you how well your child is progressing: "very well", "well" or "with difficulty"
- highlights strengths and next steps in learning


## **Holiday Hampers - Coming in December**



## **November is Indigenous Education Month**


