- encourages early and ongoing communication between you and your child's teacher
- tells you how well your child is developing the six learning skills and work habits
- reports on all academic subjects such as language, math, social studie or science and technology but instead of assigning a grade or mark, it will tell you how well your child is progressing: "very well", "well" or "with difficulty"
- highlights strengths and next steps in learning

Time Change - Fall Back


Daylight saving time 2023 will come to an end on November 5, so don't forget to adjust your clock back one hour when the time comes.


We will also use this day to take class photos.



November is Hindu Heritage Month

This year's theme is *Vasudhaiva Kutumbakum: The World is One Family.*

Hinduism is one of the oldest living religions which have flourished for over 10,000 years. It is an occasion to recognize and celebrate the rich tapestry of traditions, teachings and values that are integral to Hinduism and practiced by millions around the world today. November is an opportunity to celebrate the Hindu way of life, examine its impact and contributions to the world culture, and recognize values which promote compassion, tolerance, and inclusion.



This year's theme is <u>Vasudhaiva Kutumbakum</u>: <u>The World is One Family</u>. Vasudhaiva Kutumbakam is a Sanskrit word in Hindu dharma that means, 'The World is one Family.' It is based on the spiritual idea that every human being is born with a divine spark and is a part of one divine universal consciousness. This ancient message of oneness aims to promote friendliness, acceptance, compassion, and a sense of belongingness toward all others, despite differences of culture, languages, or thoughts. The word Vasudhaiva means "earth" and therefore this message of caring and compassion is also meant for all living creatures and the non-living environment.


November is Indigenous Education Month

November is <u>Indigenous Education Month</u> at the Toronto District School Board. It is important to remember to center First Nations, Métis, and Inuit perspectives, voices, histories, and contemporary realities across the TDSB every day. This month places emphasis on creating opportunities to

learn from Indigenous perspectives on treaties, leadership, achievements, resurgence, futurities, and creativity. The TDSB is committed to the Truth and Reconciliation Commission of Canada: Calls to Action (TRC) and the United Nations Declaration on the Rights of Indigenous Peoples.

Treaties Recognition Week is the first full week of November 5-11.

During Treaties Recognition Week, we recognize the agreements that shape the relationships and lands across Ontario. We bring awareness to treaty rights and relationships between Indigenous and non-Indigenous Canadians.
