



TDSB Students

- *Regular English Program:* TDSB family and student must live in the TDSB-determined catchment area to attend Humberside Collegiate
- *French Program:*

 - **French Immersion schools:** Fern, Humbercrest, Rockcliffe and Runnymede
- **End of February** – Completed course selection sheets/applications must be returned to the guidance counsellor at your elementary school

NON-TDSB Students Living in District


- *Regular English Program:*

ONTARIO SECONDARY SCHOOL DIPLOMA

- **30** credits (110 hours each)
- **18** compulsory subjects
- **12** elective courses
- 40 hours community involvement
- Ontario Secondary School Literacy Test (Grade 10)

Making Course Type Choices: Academic, Applied or Locally Developed?

Academic Course (D)

- Covers **essential concepts** (knowledge & skills) + additional materials
- Emphasis is on **theoretical** approach + **abstract thinking**

Applied Course (P) – Being phased out by TDSB

- Covers **essential concepts** (knowledge & skills)
- Relates to **familiar, real-life situations** + **uses hands-on applications** with some theory to support learning

Locally Developed Course (E) – Not offered at HCI

- For students with gaps in knowledge and skills in the specific discipline
- Requires a lot of support from teachers



TRANSITION FROM GRADE 8 TO 9

- **Students come into high school with a variety of skill levels and understanding of math**
- **First month is spent on Number Sense and bringing the class to the same level**
 - *Review of integer operations, exponents, fractions, expressions with variables*
- **“Getting Ready for Grade 9” work package will be emailed in June for students to complete over the summer in preparation for September**

ONTARIO MATH CURRICULUM



Notes:

- T – transfer course
- LDCC – locally developed compulsory credit course (LDCC courses are not outlined in the curriculum document.)

ONTARIO MATH CURRICULUM

- Important for parents/guardians to understand the math pathways in the Ontario curriculum so they can make informed decisions – feel free to ask questions!
- A reminder that taking a “mixed” or “college” level math course does not prevent students from attending university
 - *For example, a student wishing to study humanities at university typically does not require a Grade 12 U level math*

MATH AT HUMBERSIDE

- A variety of courses are offered to students
- Extra help and support from teachers is generally available before or after school
 - *Most teachers have websites with completed note sets and practice assessments*
- School runs all the major mathematics competitions and has a lunchtime math club

Language Immersion at Humberside CI

French Immersion and Extended French

- **French Immersion (FI)** : 10 credits where the language of instruction is French
- **Extended French (EF)** : 7 credits where the language of instruction is French

*** Additional credits lead to an Honours Certificate
Certificat d'Honneur d'études bilingues.

*** ***Students must be enrolled in either the FI or EF programs.***
