- 1. Special Guest Community Police Liaison Committee (CPLC) Civilian Co-chair Sylvia Kwan
  - Sylvia Kwan brought applications for the CPLC as they are seeking volunteers from our community
  - Volunteers would be involved in social media to see and report what is happening in the community

- 2. Special Guest Trustee Dan Maclean and TDSB staff discussed HVV's water safety concerns
  - Concerns regarding the water in the school and the levels of lead
  - Letters went home this week regarding the update.
  - The fountains that weren't tested have been blocked to be proactive and the ones that were tested have been unblocked & retested and are excellent.
  - The window to test is between May and October and due to the concerns they came early to test.
  - 2-3 fountains and taps that were in the classroom as well
  - In 2017/2018 there 15 faucets sampled that were well below the levels of 10 which is really good but due to the concerns in the neighbourhood, they've retested all
  - Average readings now are 2.6 which is excellent
  - The city is putting in a new main which will do wonders for all in the area
  - The fountain that was removed in the fall developed a higher level of lead due to it not being used often enough
  - Anything over 10 micrograms needs to be taken out of service immediately
  - Soldering of the plumbing is the source of the lead and the fittings are brass or copper pipes
  - All results will be published April 5
  - Every school has their reading results in a binder in caretakers office
  - Mrs. Barone-Pace got an email in August saying the fountain was out of order and it was removed but she was never informed about the lead. She was told they didn't want to cause worry. The results weren't given to her until recently.
  - In future, lesson learned and parents and community will be informed asap on the events of testing and results

### 3. Principal's Report - Mrs. Barone-Pace

- Math contests for grades 3 6 is on April 17th. The grade 7 & 8 test will be in May but there is no date as yet.
- Earth week is the week of April 15th
- There are many Scientists in school sessions coming up.
- April 12th Duffle Bag theater coming for grades k-3 of Sleeping Beauty
- 2 prologues have been rebooked
- The staff allocation is being worked by Romina and is based on a new staffing model. She will share more on this in the council meeting in May.
- ESL hasn't been given yet.
- Primary grades will likely have a lot of split classes.
- Reorg is probable for the 3<sup>rd</sup> week of September
- Projected enrolment is 394; we are currently at 416
- Primary cap is unchanged at 20 and Kinder at 29
- Ir 4-8 grades never really had a cap but average is 28
- This year's grade 8 classes are at 30

- Sitting at \$4500 raised to date.
- Council has finished paying out all of the amount voted and agreed on except for an Antibullying seminar, which is still being looked into.
