If you are picking up your child(ren) before dismissal, please arrive early to sign them out and wait for your child(ren) to come to the office.

#### ...Late

If your child arrives after the morning or lunch bell, they must go to the office for a late slip. Parents, please refrain from entering through the student doors. If classes are still coming in, your child may enter the building and go straight to class. There are many staff members around to support your child as they walk to class. Once the doors are closed, please bring your child to the front doors and into the office for a late slip.

# ...And when signing out your child

If your child is getting signed out for an appointment or any other reason for early dismissal, please avoid calling the office in advance to let them know you are on your way and need your child signed out. Students will be signed out once their parent/ guardian arrives at the office and signs them out in our sign-out book. The office admin team will call down your child from their class to greet you in the office.

### **DROP-OFF & PICK-UP**

There has been an increase in the number of cars stopping to park along Cherrywood Avenue to either drop off or pick up students throughout the day. In some cases, the illegally parked cars are blocking the school bus in the morning at the front of the school, as well as causing traffic jams on neighbourhood streets. These cars often block crosswalks that our students and families use. Please note that parking is only permitted along the west side (southbound) of Cherrywood Avenue and the east (northbound) side of Humewood Drive. Please do not park your car in the way of a crosswalk, intersection, or front of the school.

# HELP MAKE THIS A SAFE WINTER SEASON

As winter approaches, we know that severe weather will be part of our daily lives for the next several months. While traffic safety is an important matter all year long, this is a particularly good time to review what we can do to keep students safe.

The need to be aware and alert at all times, on any road, and even in the most routine circumstances is key to traffic safety. This applies to students and drivers alike. Road conditions can be challenging in the winter months. So to those of us who drive, please take extra care on the roads and in parking lots, especially in areas where children might be present.

School staff periodically review street and traffic safety with students. Parents can help reinforce these safety messages with children at home. Below are some tips that might be helpful to review.

- Stop, look, and listen for traffic.
- Only cross at corners and crosswalks.
- ♦ Make eye contact with drivers.
- Walk on the right side of the crosswalk.
- Wear appropriate footwear to reduce the chances of slipping.
- ♦ Never run into the street.
- Obey crossing signals.
- ♦ Cross only if clear.
- Walk on sidewalks.
- Where there are no sidewalks, walk as far away from traffic as possible, facing traffic.

The safety of our students is always a top priority. Let's work together to make the winter season safe so we can enjoy all it has to offer.

# French Programs Application Deadline

For families interested in the TDSB's French Immersion or Extended French programs, we offer an online process for applying to: Early French Immersion (EFI) which begins in Senior Kindergarten & Junior Extended French (JEF) which begins in Grade 4 At this time, we guarantee an offer of placement in the program (not a specific school) to all on-time applicants. The timelines for applying for these programs for September 2020 are:

- Applications for Early French Immersion (for a Junior Kindergarten aged child), were to be completed online between November 4, 2019 and November 29, 2019.
- Applications for Junior Extended French must be completed online between January 6, 2020 and January 31, 2020. Offers of placement within your chosen program will be made to all on-time applicants in the weeks following the close of the application window.

Please Note: families with an older sibling currently in a French program are still required to complete an online application for the new student. For further information about French as a Second Language programs, the application process and important dates, please visit www.tdsb.on.ca/french.

# Being Scent Aware @ Humewood

Exposure to perfumes and other scented products can trigger serious health reactions in individuals with asthma, allergies, migraines or chemical sensitivities. Fragrances are found in a wide range of products, including perfume, cologne, deodorant, soap, fabric softeners and laundry detergents. It is a personal choice to use fragrances, however, fragrance chemicals by their very nature, are shared. The chemicals vaporize into the air and are easily inhaled by those around us.

We've noticed quite a few students in the junior/intermediate grades bringing in fragrances to school including, Febreze, washroom air fresheners, body mists, spray deodorant, and other deodorizers. These items are NOT to be brought to school. For students who wear deodorant, they are encouraged to wear either the roll-on or stick type instead of a spray or aerosol. Students can also wear a fragrance-free option as well.

The TDSB is asking for voluntary cooperation towards a scent-reduced environment at school. Staff, students and visitors are strongly encouraged to avoid or reduce the use of fragranced products, and to replace them with unscented alternatives. This is a request to voluntarily refrain from chemical-based scented products, and not a ban on scented products.

### What is OPAL?

"OPAL (Outdoor Play and Learning) is the first program in Canada that aims to make play an integral part of the school day. Children engage in self-directed play with "loose parts" (tools, boxes, spare tires, fabric, etc.), boosting their sense of agency and creating a more inclusive and reciprocal social environment.

OPAL is grounded in the child's right to play and the UN Convention on the Rights of the Child, to which Canada is a signatory.

In partnership with the Toronto District School Board (TDSB), the OPAL program will roll out to 42 schools by 2020. Our goal is to bring the program to schools across the country." (From the Earth Day Canada website)

## **Humewood's Play Policy**

At Humewood we recognise that all play is at the heart of healthy development for children. Play is self-directed, fluid, flexible and open involving experimentation and imagination.

We recognise that in order to learn, children must push the boundaries of what is already known and already easily accomplished and this requires children to experience risks and challenges.

We encourage children to understand and challenge their own limits and we provide a supportive environment for risk-taking. We teach and use a risk-benefit approach to manage our duty of care to protect and provide for children's needs.

All students are provided with a range of choices and opportunities to play in order to build connections with and to care for their environment and community.

We believe it is our responsibility to safeguard and support all children's right to play.

# So What Are Students Drinking These Days @ Humewood?

Consider the ingredients in that 20-ounce bottle of pop: Carbonated water, artificial flavours, a little caffeine, and about 17 teaspoons of sugar, which together add up to 250 calories. Students who are leaving school for lunch aren't spending their money wisely and are often found carrying large fountain drinks of sugary juice or soda pop, or large bottles of energy drinks like Gatorade. These chemical-filled drinks are expensive and provide zero nutritional value to our students' diets. Students are also left with a sugar rush in the afternoon, often affecting their academic performance.

Let's make a conscious effort to reduce the spending and litter of sugary drinks and turn to a natural, healthier, and free choice—**WATER**. Students are encouraged to bring a labelled reusable bottle to school that can be filled throughout their school day.
