12 Have family members say a sentence using the word 'thanks' (e.g., Thanks for the cookie.)	13	14	15 Make up sentences using different words (e.g., table, book, school). Include your home language.	16	17	18 Talk about the punctuation marks (e.g., periods, commas, question marks) in a book.
19	20 Find an 'asking' sentence (question) in a book.	21	22 Count how many sentences are on a page in a story.	23	24 Read or talk about sentences in other languages.	25
26 Read a story and leave off the last word. Talk about why you need the last word.	27	28 Have your child find one long sentence and one short sentence in a familiar book.	29	30 Write sentences on paper and cut the sentence into words.
