Classroom Placements Requests - 2023-2024

As preparations for the 2023-2024 school year commence, class building and placement of students will occur during the week of May 23-25. The placement of students in their new classrooms for September 2023 may include the following considerations:

- Balance in learning and social emotional strengths and needs
- Students' abilities and strengths including learning profiles of students (and class learning profile)
- Class size (Ministry requirements including primary class size caps)
- Balance of achievement levels and learning styles
- Students' social-emotional needs and learning skills/behaviour
- Social dynamics that will enable students' social development and well-being
- Balance of interpersonal relations including positive and challenging friendships
- Support programs (Students receiving ESL programming; students on an IEP; students with an exceptionality as determined by a decision of the IPRC review)
- * We will not entertain requests for specific teachers as teacher allocations are tentative and subject to change on short notice due to factors including teacher requested transfers, Vacancy postings and transfers (system-wide), teacher surplus, leaves, and/or reorganization. *

We are committed to establishing classes that will provide for the best learning opportunities for each and every child. Please provide any additional insights that you believe may be helpful in placing your child on or before May 17th, 2023 in the Google form accessible online at <u>https://forms.gle/7KmPmDXUzNMEwZXC8</u>Please only answer questions that you feel are relevant to your child's learning profile. While we will look at the information, there are several single grade classrooms that are part of the school/classroom organization for grades 1, 4, 5 and 6, which does not provide flexibility in student placement decisions at these grade levels.
