Learning in Madame Yaroski & Monsieur Pascal's SK Class

In Room 1 the students have been working on shapes of different sizes, as well as finding shapes in everyday objects around them. We have built stories about shapes, we have created pictures using shapes, and even modeled shapes with pipe cleaners and playdoh. The students are enjoying exploring the different shapes and using their imagination to create unique images of the way they see the world.

In these photos, the students had to organize the punctuality of students in an (unnamed) class, create a bar graph, analyze it, and suggest which actions they would take if they were the teacher of that class. Using their background knowledge, they suggested the teacher could talk to their students to try to understand why they are late (not enough sleep, late breakfast, bus issues...) and if necessary, meet with parents or guardians to discuss the issue.

- By listening to their child's thoughts and ideas
- By helping them to collect materials they may need
- By helping them record their ideas to paper
- By making suggestions
- By reading with the child about the topic

Flu Season



Flu season is here again. In Canada, flu season tends to run between October and April. The Ontario government is encouraging Ontarians to avoid getting sick this flu season by getting their annual flu shot.

Toronto Public Health is recommending that whenever students and staff experience flu-like symptoms, they are sent home and do not return to school until they are no longer infectious to others. Therefore, ill students and staff should be symptom-free (especially from vomiting and diarrhea) for at least 48 hours before returning to school.

The primary concern is for the health and safety of all students and staff. Please note that no special measures are required when there is a case of influenza in a school or daycare. However, everyone should do their part to stop the spread of the flu. As parents, you can also assist by:

- Reminding children to wash their hands often especially after using the washroom and before and after eating;

- Reminding children to cover their sneeze and cough;
- Watching for symptoms of vomiting, diarrhea, dizziness, and/or high fever;
- Informing the school if your child is ill;
- Keeping your child at home when he/she is ill.
