STAY HEALTHY DURING FLU SEASON!



Flu season is here again. In Canada, flu season tends to run between October and April. The Ontario government is encouraging Ontarians to avoid getting sick this flu season by getting their annual flu shot.

Toronto Public Health is recommending that whenever students and staff experience flulike symptoms, they are sent home and do not return to school until they are no longer infectious to others. Therefore, ill students and staff should be symptom-free (especially from vomiting and diarrhea) for at least 48 hours before returning to school.

The primary concern is for the health and safety of all students and staff.

Here are some tips to help prevent spread of flu: - reminding children to wash their hands often especially after using the washroom and before and after eating;

- reminding children to cover their sneeze and cough;

- watching for symptoms of vomiting, diarrhea, dizziness, and/or high fever;

- informing the school if your child is ill;

- keeping your child at home when he/she is ill.

HEALTH and WELL BEING

Our dental screening took place in December for all students at Islington JMS! Here are some important facts that can help us make good choices that promote dental health:

- 4 grams of sugar is equal to 1 teaspoon of sugar.
- 1 juice box has almost 6 teaspoons of sugar. It's clearly better to eat the fresh fruit for nutritional purposes and drink plain old water
- 1 can of coke has almost 10 teaspoons of sugar
- 1 small carton of chocolate milk has 6 teaspoons of sugar, whereas white milk has half the amount. White milk is obviously the better option
- 15 smarties has 11grams of sugar just under 3 teaspoons.
- 1 42gram aero bar has 24 grams of sugar, that's 6 teaspoons of sugar
- Small Iced cappuccino from Tim Hortons has 33 grams of sugar, that's 8.25 teaspoons
- A strawberry banana smoothie from Tim Hortons has 27 grams of sugar, that's almost 7 teaspoons
- A snack bag of mini oreos (42g bag) has 17 grams of sugar. Just over 4 teaspoons

ACHIEVEMENT

We continue to explore **Social Justice** as a vehicle for teaching all of the disciplines in the Ontario Curriculum. Research tells us that, if students are engaged by relevant contexts that reflect their experiences and garner their interest, they are more likely to do well in their subjects. For instance, our Grade 8s are learning about issues such as poverty, racism, sexism, homophobia, the environment and discrimination and the degree to which they place many people at a disadvantage in comparison to others. In Math, they are examining data (as part of Data Management) from Statistics Canada to help them understand the impact of such issues in our country and to ultimately identify how we can help make a difference. They are reading fiction and non-fiction texts to help them further understand these issues and they are communicating their thinking, thoughts, ideas and opinions in both oral and written form. In the primary grades, students are critically examining different gender roles and stereotypes and discussing how we can change those to be more inclusive and respectful of all people and identities.

We are committed to providing learning environments in which student voice drives the learning, the contexts are rich and the classroom walls are reflective of their THINKING. Our teachers are continuing to engage in professional learning that helps them develop this type of programming in collaborative and informative ways.
