

The team designed and built a machine using pulleys which could be used used to move sandbags in flooded regions. Their model's design and function won them 3rd place in the province! On May 15th the waste crew performed a waste audit of our school's garbage, compost, and recycling bins. They randomly chose locations around the school and sorted the waste into their correct containers and weighed the results. WELL-BEING and EQUITY

Islington, along with the rest of TDSB, highlighted mental health and well-being during the week of May 6 – 10. Along with Student Ministry, we had Mental Health Monday announcements, Talk-o Tuesday to promote talking to someone about your problems, Wellness Wednesday where Intermediate students visited classes to discuss nutrition and healthy eating options. We played meditative music on Thoughtful Thursday when we had schoolwide quiet time for reflection, stretching, journaling etc. Finally, we wrapped up Friday with Fitness Friday when our PA system played lively music to get the whole school moving!! All these elements form a part of mental health and well-being that is a goal for students and staff alike – to keep us healthy, resilient and able to face the challenges that we encounter. We joined Fitness Friday with our WE Club who led Islington in WE Walk for Water, an initiative that raised funds to bring Fresh Water to communities around the world that do not have it.

Kinder Corner



Here are some examples of the hands-on literacy activities that happen in Kindergarten classes.

Hands-on letter formation combines counting with directionality and letter-sound recognition.

The Poem of the Week, an element of Shared Reading, gives students a chance to be 'word detectives' and search for 'Lollipop Words' (high-frequency words). Our detectives also look for punctuation marks!! The Leaders of the Day take turns to lead the reading by pointing to each word as all classmates say or sing the poem, count words, count letters in words, etc.

This math table develops numeracy skills where students can count, label, manipulate parts, and identify shapes.

Student Achievement:

During the month of May it is important to take the time to acknowledge and celebrate Asian Heritage Month. Did you know that more than 40% of TDSB students identify as an Asian? It is important to have the opportunity to celebrate the many achievements and contributions of Asian Canadians with our classmates and teachers. 
