

# Minutes of the School Council – February 28, 2019

### Vice-Principal Mr. Newman Addressed the School Council

- New Vice-Principal, Mr. Newman told the School Council about himself. He is from Jamaica and has taught in several countries. He was a teacher at John English JMS.
- He has a personal commitment to teach and loves to connect with students. His philosophy is that while he commands respect, it should be mutual. He sets an example of respect by demonstrating respect towards students.

### Principal/Vice-Principal's Report – J. Petko

- Recent Events
  - Ms. Petko welcomed Mr. Newman to JSB.
  - The Ice Hockey team finished its season. The Jr. Girls Volleyball team are city champions. Basketball finals are underway, and Mini Sticks house league is wrapping up.
  - Several clubs are running: Lego Club, Chess Club, and Rock Band.
  - The Cardboard Canoe Challenge was rescheduled to February 22. A group of senior students also attended a STEM conference on February 28.
  - Ten grade 7/8 students are participating in the TDSB All-City Orchestra at Roy Thomson Hall on May 2.
  - Many students and their families participated in the X-Movement Power family fun night in January.
  - On February 26, the Humber Health Fair was at JSB to support mental health and wellbeing. There is a focus on wellness and on the whole person. Students were very involved and engaged.
  - Students participated in many events during Black History Month. Senior students went to a presentation at Etobicoke School of the Arts. Junior students went to an exhibit at Humber College. Students participated in activities before and after the events. There will be a Tounkande presentation at the school on March 6.
  - February's character trait is Fairness, and March's will be Honesty.
- Green Team
  - The Green Team continues to emphasize the importance of reusing and recycling.
- Equity Work at JSB
  - The school Equity Team conducted an equity walk/survey, in which they walk through the school examining resources (books, items posted on the walls) to check whether all students are represented. Through the equity walk, the team realized that LGBTQIA2-S (lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, queer, intersexual, asexual, two-spirited) students were not represented.
  - Student focus groups were held with 80 grade 5-7 students (eight focus groups of 10 students) representing a spectrum of voices (abilities, gender, ethnicity, socio-economic status). The focus groups were led by adults who were not their teachers, and students

were asked how they felt about the school, their peers and their perceptions of safety. Data was collected anonymously. Staff will review the data to identify needs, and will target and put strategies in place to address these needs. This information feeds into the School Improvement Plan.

- The school is considering setting up an all-gender washroom. It would either be a washroom only with stalls and no urinals, or a staff washroom would be converted to a single washroom.
- A new TDSB dress code will be in place in September. The dress code, which had not been updated since 2009, will apply to all schools in the TDSB. Currently dress codes apply at the school level and can vary from school to school.
- 2019-20 Staffing
  - The school has begun planning staffing for next year. The staffing model and classroom organization must comply with the cap size of 29 students for kindergarten classes, and a cap size of 20 students for grades 1-3.
  - A parent consultation group will be formed of School Council members to provide input on the proposed staffing model. The proposed model must be approved by the superintendent by April 15. In March/early April, Ms. Petko will email the proposed model to the School Council group for feedback.

- As of February 28, 2019, the total bank balance was \$13,645.42. After earmarking funds for the Hot Lunch Room fund, and outstanding cheques, the closing operating balance was \$12,793.92.

## School Council Report and New Business

- Parent Involvement Advisory Committee (PIAC) School Council Appreciation Event
  - The Chair attended the PIAC School Council Appreciation event and provided highlights and ideas from other School Councils.
  - The School Council discussed using the school's phone blasts to advertise School Council meetings and events to increase outreach to families and expand communication. There will be a stand-alone email blast to advertise the upcoming parent workshops.
  - The School Council discussed ideas to engage families without having to spend money:
    - a social evening
    - being inclusive of parents bringing young children with them to volunteer
    - creating "survival kits" for transition grades (JK, grade 1 and grade 6)
    - having at School Council table at parent-teacher interviews
    - Santa photos fundraiser
    - Providing glow sticks at the Dance-a-thon

- Consider developing guidelines for the School Council's use of social media
- Parent Reaching Out (PRO) Grant Power Struggles Workshop
  - The School Council was awarded a \$1,000 Ministry of Education PRO Grant to be used for three parenting workshops by the Parent Education Network. The workshops are: Power Struggles (March 5), Homework Strategies and Study Skills (April 3), and How to Talk So Kids Will Listen, How to Listen So Kids Will Talk (May 2).
  - The School Council will send an email blast, and the school will send an email blast and phone blast to advertise the event to the greatest number of families.
  - Babysitting will be provided. A survey will be prepared to gather participant feedback.
- Webinars for School Council Members
  - Webinars for TDSB School Councils will be available on YouTube.
- TDSB Consultations
  - The TDSB is consulting on several policies.
    - Dress Code closes February 28
    - Caring and Safe Schools closes on March 4
    - Home Instruction Policy closes on March 15
- Parents as Partners Conference
  - The Parents as Partners conference is on March 30. This is a free event for TDSB families. Child care, bussing and lunch are provided for free.
- Bellapalooza Planning Update
  - The School Council discussed Bellapalooza planning. Lakeshore CI's cyberArts students will once again design the Bellapalooza poster.
  - There is a Bellapalooza Planning Committee meeting on March 3.
