

## Minutes of the School Council – June 14, 2018

### Principal's Report – J. Petko

- *JSB Recent and Upcoming Events*
  - The school thanked the School Council and parent volunteers for their hard work on large and small initiatives to benefit the school and students.
  - Ten students competed at the track and field City Final meet on June 12. They represented the school well and some received medals.
  - There were a lot of sports teams this year, with students participating on multiple teams, as well as students participating in house league sports. There were also opportunities for students to get involved in music, arts, robotics, and eco-school. The school had its Eco-School audit and will maintain its gold status.
  - The character trait for June is “Perseverance.” The Terrific Tigers assembly is on June 28.
  - There is a dance for grade 7/8 students on June 25.
  - The grade 4-6 classes have field trips to the movies.
- *Primary-Junior Spring Concert*
  - The Singing-in-the-Round spring concert for kindergarten to Grade Five students is on **Wednesday, June 20** at 9:15am in the gym.
- *Graduation*
  - The Grade Eight graduation is on **Wednesday, June 27** at 10am in the gym.
  - Following the ceremony, students will go to the Mandarin for lunch.
- *Cali Kim – Public Health Nurse*
  - The school’s public health nurse discussed opportunities for parent workshops the School Council could host next year. The School Council is interested in nutrition and healthy lunches.
  - Public health nurses no longer offer one-off events. LAMP could be a resource.
  - Public health could do a Home Alone workshop for students age 10-14.
  - The School Council discussed ideas for mental health, stress management and resiliency workshops.

### Treasurer's Report

- Read and received.
- As of May 31, 2018, the total bank balance was \$6,820.58. After earmarking funds for the Hot Lunch Room fund the closing operating balance was \$6,168.48.
- The May Pizza Lunch raised \$311.25, and the May Subway Lunch raised \$143.75. The May Hot Dog Lunch raised \$250.90, which will be allocated to the Hot Lunch Program. These funds were held to use as Bellapalooza floats.
- Bellapalooza raised a total profit of \$8,003.36.
- \$600 was allocated for the Grade 8 graduation lunch at the Mandarin.

- \$2,600 was allocated for the teachers for classroom enhancements.
- \$955 was allocated for a tent canopy.

## **School Council Report and New Business**

- *Budget and Allocations*
  - The School Council asked Ms. Petko for the school's 2017-18 wish list. Items identified were more technology, six new basketball nets and backboards for the gym, experiential workshops (like X-Movement), and a JSB-branded tent canopy for sports teams to use at meets and tournaments.
  - As a thank you from the School Council, each teacher will receive \$100 to spend in their classrooms in the fall. Teachers should make their purchases and submit receipts to the School Council for reimbursement. The total cost is \$2,600.
  - The School Council is purchasing a JSB-branded tent canopy for \$955.
  - The School Council will explore options for purchasing basketball nets and backboards.
- *Graduation Lunch at the Mandarin*
  - The School Council is contributing \$600 to the Grade Eight graduation lunch at the Mandarin.
- *Fall Dates*
  - The Welcome Back BBQ is tentatively scheduled for **Thursday, September 20.**
  - The School Council Executive Nomination forms will be due on **Tuesday, September 25.**
  - The first School Council meeting of the year will be on **Thursday, September 27.**
- *2018-19 School Council Events*
  - The School Council discusses planning the year's events and communicating them to parents early in the year.
- *First Day of School Package*
  - The School Council will provide the school with the materials to be included in the package sent home on the first day of school. The deadline to submit the School Council Executive Nomination form and School Council letter is August 27.
